Two additional members joined at our February meeting, Audrey Ellis and Alison Davis, to whom we extend a very warm welcome. This was the last of our winter afternoon meetings which we tried as an experiment this year and which appears to have been successful.

Carolyn Millen and her daughter Julie gave an excellent informative and humorous talk on Snowdrops, which can be seen in abundance in their garden at Platts Garden, which opens under the National Gardens scheme so you have to visit as per the Scheme. They started collecting and propagating snowdrops in 2003 and now have over 400 varieties. Many are produced by 'chipping' which involves slicing a bulb vertically into orange-like segments, when as many as 15 or so bulbs can be flowering after 3 years rather than 2 or 3 by splitting clumps. The golden rule when doing this is to ensure everything is absolutely sterile, they use methylated spirits, and to have a great deal of patience. A prize of a named snowdrop was provided to Marjorie Derby who guessed (or paid particular attention and knew) the number of times the word Snowdrop was uttered during the talk.

The monthly raffle, as ever, was well supported. No-one seemed interested in the Invisible gardening outfit (see photo) which we (a) couldn't find and (b) were concerned at disposing of via Ebay or similar as there are enough problems with mis-deliveries as it is.

Our annual plant sale takes place on 13 May at Little Hatch (opposite Lee Davey caravans) by kind agreement of Michael and Denise so put that date in your phone, nearly said diary but must move with the times.

We are hoping to arrange an outing to Wisley on Thursday 11 May, depending upon numbers. Entry to one RHS garden is free to HGS members each year so that's another reason to join our group.

Harrietsham History Society

Despite the cold and damp weather 14 members and 6 visitors attended our first meeting of 2023 on Tuesday 7 February at 2pm when our speaker Mr John Harris, a volunteer with the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, gave us a presentation on their work.



Mr Harris's talk included reference to the five Commission War graves in the churchyard at St John the Baptist, Harrietsham. Three of the graves have the remains of men who died as a result of injuries received during the First World War, George Seal who died on the 22 October 1918, Harold Tupper who died on 22 July 1918 as a result of injuries received in August 1916 and Daniel Young who died on the 15 August 1917. The other two graves have the remains of two men who served in the Second World War, Maurice Curtis who died on 4 November 1947 and Stewart Walker who died on the 11 January 1944.

Our next meeting is on Tuesday 11 April in the village hall starting at 7.30pm when we will have a talk by James Dickinson on King John and the Magna Carta. We should be into better weather and lighter evenings following the clocks going forward by one hour on Sunday 26 March so I hope you will be able to come along, visitors are always welcome to attend our meetings for a small charge of \pounds 3.00.

New rules for voting

The Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station.

The forms of acceptable ID are:

- Passport
- driving licence (this includes a provisional driving licence)
- blue badge
- older person's or disabled person's bus pass
- identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card) or
- biometric immigration document.

If you do not have any of these you are able to apply for a voter authority certificate the deadline date is **5pm on 25 April**.

More information on all these can be found by ringing MBC on 01622 602007or going to their website.

You do not need ID for postal voting and postal vote application deadline is **5pm 18 April.**

If you are not registered to vote the deadline date is 11.59pm Monday 17 April .




King Arthur may have known a thing or two with his offer of sit at my table and be equally valued.
