

Teers Meadow

Harrietsham Parish Council is delighted to announce they have been awarded £40,900 by the National Lottery Heritage Fund to safeguard and manage Teers Meadow. The aim of the project is to encourage and educate local residents, and the wider area, of the benefits of caring for our unique landscape. Teers Meadow has many interesting species of plants such as the common spotted orchid, pyramidal orchid and twayblades. It is also home to protected reptiles including the slow-worm and viviparous lizard.

The project will begin in the autumn of 2019 by installing new post and rail fencing and access gates and by removing some of the bushes that are taking over the site. Once secure, grazing cattle will be moved in to clear the grassland so that rare chalk grassland plants can flourish.

Parish Council Chairman, Eddie Powell said "This is a very exciting project for Harrietsham. We are fortunate to live in a village on the edge of the Kent Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and this will encourage residents of all ages to look and appreciate the countryside in which we live. Volunteers wishing to take part should contact harrietshampc.@aol.com"

The Parish Council wish to thank Harrietsham Primary School, Marjorie Darby (who is a Health Walk Leader) and our local Scouts Group in supporting our bid for National Lottery funding. We are particularly grateful to the Kent Field Club for their valuable input in assisting us in winning this grant. The Kent Field Club Secretary commented "The reintroduction of grazing and the thinning of the scrub will begin to return this site to favourable condition and will make a valuable contribution to restoring one of these precious remnants of chalk grassland".



Harrietsham History Society

On Wednesday 12 June a small group of members met at the new Biggin Hill Museum which opened its doors to visitors for the first time on 2 February 2019 following a 16-month construction project.

On arriving at the entrance we found it guarded by a full sized replica Supermarine Spitfire and Hawker Hurricane. Both types of WW2 fighter aircraft flew from Biggin Hill in wartime. The Museum is on the same site as the St Georges RAF Chapel of Remembrance built in 1951 to preserve the legacy of those who served and died at Biggin Hill during the Second World War.

On entering the Museum we were welcomed by volunteers who demonstrated how to use the free portable information guide, although most of us found it easier to walk through the Museum reading all of the information on the displays and collections which tell the story of Britain's most famous fighter station through the personal experiences of those who served there and the community that supported them.

The last RAF unit left Biggin Hill in October 1992 when the Selection Centre moved to RAF Cranwell. Today, the RAF's 75 year tenure at Biggin Hill and the 454 allied aircrew who were killed during WW2 while operating from the Biggin Hill Sector are commemorated in St George's Royal Air Force Chapel of Remembrance. The Chapel, which is still an active church, was built and dedicated in 1951. This replaced the first station church which was destroyed by fire in 1946. The present Chapel retains some of the internal appearance of the original church, and has exceptionally fine stained glass windows, designed by Hugh Easton, as well as a number of other interesting artefacts. Thousands of people visit the chapel each year, and in addition to regular weekly services, special commemorative services are held on Battle of Britain Sunday and Remembrance Sunday.

We ended our visit with refreshments in the small café and all agreed it had been a very worthwhile visit.

In July we had an outing to Kenward Trust in Yalding. Some of our members had asked to visit as this had been one of the charities that we supported in the previous year.

It was a lovely afternoon and the staff at the Trust made us extremely welcome. We started with a delicious tea, assorted sandwiches (with the crusts removed!) scones with cream and jam and a lovely array of cakes. We then had a talk about the work of the trust given by one of the staff. The Trust was started 50 years ago by Mr & Mrs Sinden when they realised the need for homeless people to have somewhere to stay so that they could try to turn their lives around. They can have a total of 19 residents (9 men and 10 women) at any one time and they usually come for an initial stay of 12 weeks. Since its beginning the trust has grown to include helping people with addictions such as drink and drugs. They have access to counselling services but they are also given the opportunity to learn life skills. They are encouraged to do things such as woodworking, craft making and gardening during their time at the house and there was evidence of their work in the shop, which is in the house. Some of the residents are self funding, some come through social services but the Trust also relies heavily on donations from groups such as ours and fund raising by various activities during the year.

Once the talk had finished we all had a look round the shop which was selling a wide variety of goods and then went on a woodland walk round the grounds. We met the alpacas who were looking very smart with their shorn coats, the goats, the chickens and the ducks. A veritable menagerie – all cared for by the residents. This was a good outing thoroughly enjoyed by all the members who went.

Our next meeting is in September which will be our 'Members Evening' when we will be exploring the many varied talents of our ladies. We are always happy to welcome new members to our meetings at the Booth Hall on the first Wednesday of the month



Top Tips - Gardening for August

August can be a funny old time in the garden with many people on holiday who then come back to marrows instead of courgettes, stringy runner beans, bullet peas and woody beetroot in the veg. patch and a mass of dead heads and seed pods in the shrub and flower borders. The thing is, of course, to remove all vestigial courgettes, beans and peas before you go and also although it may seem a crying shame cut off any blooms that are starting to fade so you return to fresh green growth. If not already done in July divide Iris rhizomes as they will root at this time of year and if you are feeling energetic traditionally yew, beech and hornbeam hedges should be clipped in August. This process means beech hedges, for example, will retain their leaves through the winter to help screen and provide shelter. Also any pruning of plums and cherries can be undertaken at this time of year. If treated like other top fruit and pruned in winter, diseases such as silver leaf can set in.

Onions and shallots can all be lifted now and left on the ground or put in the greenhouse if there's room to allow the sun to dry the skins thoroughly which will help them to keep. It's also time to sow a few cabbages to pick next spring. A good variety is Duncan which will stand well all winter and be ready when there is little else around. Once the tops have died down and dried on maincrop potatoes they should be lifted too, more towards the end of the month depending on the season. If you want to try obtaining a few new potatoes for December plant a few 'Charlotte' in tubs at the end of the month and stand these in a greenhouse later – success depends a lot upon the weather in Autumn.

As for lawns keep the mower blades high this month, 40mm or so and don't worry if we enter a dry spell and the grass appears to die off, it hasn't, it's only dormant and will grow again once it rains. Any grass areas you've left in the current mode for meadow or wild flowers should be cut down in August and all the vegetation completely removed which will remove competition from those lovely flowers such as cowslips and orchids which may appear of their own volition next year! Finally, have a look around the garden and decide where you'd like to see some more bulbs next Spring as it will be time to think about buying and planting these next month.

However, this man's niece had suddenly discovered the thrills of adrenalin. He described her as a little bundle of joy who had, only a year before, cried at the thought of getting on to something fast and furious. But now she was pleading with her uncle to join her on the roller coaster and so he did! He looked around anxiously at the snarling twists and turns that lay before him as he took his place next to her on the front seat. He was petrified and closed his eyes. He said that, in the words of St Paul he 'prayed without ceasing' as they soared up and down several times in the space of a few minutes. As others screamed and cheered with excitement he just prayed that it would all be over as quickly as possible. And then, just as they glided to a stop at the end of the track he heard those terrible words so familiar to parents when their children are having fun: 'Let's do it again! 'We have to do it again!' How could he refuse? They did it again and again FOUR times, but he said that the strange thing was that each time they set out it all seemed less frightening, certainly more bearable, and even he admitted to it being a little fun!

None of us knows what we are going to face today or tomorrow. I can't imagine that there won't be at least a few unexpected twists and turns. Most of us will be facing lives that occasionally feel like a roller coaster. Now as I face retirement in the next few weeks I will not be actively seeking out those experiences that I find frightening but I do look forward to whatever the future may bring. It won't include the London Eye or a bungee jump, but I know there will be exciting experiences, even roller coaster ones, that will bring purpose and meaning to my life, things that I will be called to as a retired priest.

Thank you for all the experiences, including thrilling adrenalin ones, that you have given me over the years. I look forward to many more knowing that 'I can do all this through him who gives me strength. (Philippians 4:13)




