- Thursday 28 March Mary Smith gave an updated talk on "A School Girl's experience", which detailed the wartime experience for pupils at Maidstone Girls Grammar School.
- Monday 13 May Harrietsham History Society's Annual General Meeting again saw a larger than expected turnout and was followed by a chance to help with some of the continued filing and indexing of our local archive.
- Monday 3 June Steve Hookings gave a talk on D-Day just a few days before the 80th anniversary. Steve comes from a military background and has visited the beaches and other sites connected with Operation Overlord.
- 20 September Bob Ogley gave a talk on "Doodlebugs and Rockets". How
 Kent was in the front line during the Second World War and took the brunt of
 Hitler's V weapons. Once again, a larger than expected turnout attended
 what was an insightful talk.
- Friday 8 November Melanie Gibson-Barton gave a talk on her ancestor, Elizabeth Barton, who stood up to King Henry VIII's religious reforms and became known as "The Holy Maid of Kent.

Looking ahead to 2025, we are thrilled to announce a packed schedule of talks and events. From local history to wider historical topics, we have some truly captivating discussions lined up, and we can't wait to welcome you to another year of learning and connection. Full details will be provided in the January edition of the Network Magazine.



Accessible Well-being - Meaning



Last time I suggested for you a challenging exercise of knowing yourself. Today I would like to up the challenge a little. I offer to you to look at the meaning of life. Do not worry, I will not go into the realm of philosophy or theology and the search for the universal meaning of life. Rather I urge you to find, or clearly articulate, the meaning of your life.

But why do I need to find the meaning? There are several benefits. It brings order into my life. When I see a clear meaning – a clearly described goal with a definite "Why" as a foundation – it becomes much easier to

go in one direction and not waste time and energy on something that is of little significance to me. This will bring a sense of accomplishment into my life and will boost my self-worth and well-being.

"When a person cannot find a deep sense of meaning, they distract themselves with pleasure." Viktor Frankl.


It also becomes a strong foundation for my mental health. Knowing where I am going and why may help to avoid situations that may cause feelings of shame or regret, which are detrimental to our mental health.

I hope this will convince you of the importance of finding meaning in your life. Now about how to find one, if you haven't yet. There may be numerous ways how you can do it. Often it comes to a person on its own, or he stumbles upon it. But if you aren't so lucky, here are a couple of suggestions for finding meaning yourself.

- Ask yourself a question. We all leave an imprint in this world, regardless we
 want it or not. Ask yourself, what kind of imprint you would like to leave
 behind. It might be something grandeur, or very simple but it will be yours.
 The way how you live up to that meaning may change over time. It is fine.
 The main thing is that you have a set direction where to go.
- 2. If asking such a big question won't work, ask smaller questions. What is the meaning of your daily tasks? What is the meaning behind cleaning your room? What is the meaning of the task you need to perform at work? Those questions will begin to fill your life with meaning, and, at the same time will help you to identify and avoid meaningless activities.

You can apply both methods or discover your own. The main thing is to find a meaning, which will enrich your life and the lives of those around you.



Lenham WI

Let me be one of the first to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. Where does the time go!!! Our new National Federation Chair, Jeryl Stone reminded us recently that there are nearly 4 million people in the UK that say they are chronically lonely – that they feel lonely often or always. Christmas is one of the worst times for people who are alone. The WI is a cure for women's loneliness and we all need to help even if it is just offering a lift to a WI meeting. A short visit or even just a phone call can make a huge difference to anyone on their own.

In October we welcomed Helen Bonser-Wilton, the CEO of Leeds Castle who came to talk to us about the castle's history. It has always been a ladies' castle, owned by Queens as well as other influential women. Helen has been at the castle for just over three years and was previously the Chief Executive for the Mary Rose in Portsmouth. The castle is 905 years old and has been part of a Charity for the last 50 years. There are 200 staff, 100 of which are volunteers and they have 9000 school children visiting each year along with 435,000 day visitors. The oldest part is the Gloriette which was built by Eleanor who was the first queen to own the castle. The Gloriette was burnt down in 1665 by Dutch prisoners of war and was not rebuilt for 300 years. There have been a number of private owners from 1552 to 1926. Lady Baillie owned the castle from 1926 to 1974. She was an amazing woman who travelled all over the world, had many men friends and entertained on a grand scale. Her guests included Errol Flynn and David Niven. She put in the swimming pool with the first wave machine and had llamas and zebras in the park. During the war the castle was used as a rehabilitation centre for severely burned pilots who had been treated at East Grinstead. Weapons research was secretly carried out in the grounds, including emergency flame weapons to counter the feared German invasion. The government minister responsible for this work, Geoffrey Lloyd, was a regular visitor during Lady Baillie's lifetime and later would become the first Chairman of the Leeds Castle Foundation.

In November Lucy Allen was our speaker and we heard about the "Life and Times of a Stunt Woman". Her background in Theatre & Circus prepared her well for stunts in which she's had a 30+ year career. She enjoys working with actors to enhance their physical performance as a Stunt Co-Ordinator. She has worked on films such as Titanic, Braveheart and James Bond's, Skyfall.

If you want to join us we meet at Lenham Community Centre on the second Thursday of the month at 7.30pm.
