





Borough Council Corner

Maidstone Borough Council is now officially a hung council, though in practical terms the former controlling conservative group remains in control with the assistance of 6 independents. The committee chairs and vice chairs have thus been allocated accordingly between them. The Cabinet is run by the conservative group and Cllr Burton remains leader.

For those not aware we have joined a Green Independent Alliance GIA. We are now completely separate from the Independent Group. This was primarily done as we have greater common ground and that they, we know, will support our continued opposition to MBC's proposal for Heathlands and 5000 homes in Lenham Heath. This alliance includes Cllr Vanessa Jones (independent) from Boxley ward who is campaigning against 2000 houses in Lidsing

Stage 2 hearings took place with the planning inspector. On Heathlands, can we publicly thank both Harrietsham & Lenham Parish Council, their councillors and legal representatives, SOHL (Save Our Heathlands) who have given so much time in particular Steve Heeley and Kate Hammond, and local resident Alison Davis who gave so much outstanding information regarding water quality and water treatment. The timeframe at the time of writing is not detailed and we will update you further on what this will be, when known.

We have had correspondence regarding Operation Brock and we are endeavouring to encourage as many residents as possible to write to our MP Helen Whately to express our collective concerns at this continued problem. Every community along the A20 has its own particular concern regarding its impact as each village is certainly affected by traffic chaos.

Finally can we say a thank you to the volunteers who contribute to ensure the community is supported from the very young to our older residents. We are indebted to the work that is done to ensure clubs run and offer so many opportunities for us all.




