Rush rush. Sometimes it seems that I rush from one thing to the next; from services to visiting, to sermon preparation, to committee meeting, to school assembly, to choosing hymns, to emailing our children, to writing the Christian Message! I am sure that all our lives are often like this, rushing along with barely time to stop, take stock, think and reflect. And if you are a parent of school-age or younger children, it's at least twice as frantic!

In his well-loved poem, W. H. Davies reminds us that there is more to life than our rushing to and fro:

"What is this life, if full of care, we have no time to stand and stare?

No time to see, in broad daylight, streams full of stars, like skies at night."

W. H. Davies

Our lives – though so full – become diminished if we don't make the time to stop, look, think and reflect. We become so centred on fulfilling the needs of those around us, or accumulating money, status and stuff, that we forget the importance of quiet.

One of the easiest ways to pray is just to stop, look at what's around and simply thank God for what you see.

#### Jesus said this:

"Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out ...? Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with me and work with me—watch how I do it. Learn the unforced rhythms of grace. I won't lay anything heavy or ill-fitting on you. Keep company with me and you'll learn to live freely and lightly."

Matthew 11:28-30 (The Message translation)

It's June. Perhaps the sun will shine. Whatever the weather, take a pause, look around you and thank God for everything. And then pray for the needs of the people and situations you're aware of. Get away with Jesus for at least a few minutes each day, "learning the unforced rhythms of grace" and see what a difference he makes.

## **Gardening Society**

The Society's meeting on the 16th April was attended by 49 members and 2 visitors. David Oversby welcomed everyone commenting on the late spring and the problems still with very cold nights making it impossible to plant anything out with the continuing possibility of overnight frost. He then introduced Bob Ogley, the speaker, who gave his talk entitled "Weather in Kent."

Bob started by mentioning this winter had been the wettest and that March had in fact been the coldest for 100 years with the coldest Easter. Up until 1987 Bob was editor of the Sevenoaks Courier newspaper but the events of the night of the 15th October changed his life completely. He was woken at about 2am by the noise of trees crashing down, pulling down overhead power cables causing the sky to light up as they crashed to the ground. On investigation Bob found his car had been squashed under an oak tree, part of his roof had been stripped of tiles and a chimney pot had crashed through his glass conservatory roof. As soon as it was light he decided to make the 6 mile walk to his office in Sevenoaks, only to find on arriving there were no longer seven oaks on the Vine cricket ground, all but one of these was now lying on the ground. He managed to locate a radio phone, contacted a friend at Biggin Hill and hired a plane flying over the whole of the area taking more than 100 photos showing the devastation to the countryside. From these he compiled a book entitled "In the Wake of the Hurricane" which by Christmas sold 5,000 copies and subsequently over 21,000 copies, making number 7 on the best sellers list.

Following the success of this he decided to do a national edition; he left his job and set up his own company. The national edition sold 265,000 copies and since then Bob has researched and published many other books. He continued his talk quoting many other historic dates for unusual weather conditions of the past century:

1962/1963 being the coldest winter when it snowed on Boxing Day and stayed through to March;

1976 was the hottest summer;

1959 had 60 continuous days without rain;

and in 1998 Canterbury recorded the highest temperature of the century, 98°F; this was beaten in 2003 by Gravesend with a temperature of 100°F but 2 weeks later Brogdale, Faversham, recorded 101°F.

He concluded his talk by mentioning the worst ever floods were at the end of January 1953, mainly affecting Canvey Island, but the greatest killer due to adverse weather was in 1952 when over 4000 people died of the effects of smog in the Greater London area.

Peter Brown thanked Bob for a very enjoyable and interesting talk and invited questions from the members.

Nine members entered this month's competition for 3 homemade sweet biscuits, this was won by Veronica Bastone (12pts); Deanna Dynes was second (10pts) and Ken Leach third (8pts).

Ten members made a visit to Cooling's Nursery at Rushmore Hill on Friday 26th April where they were given a guided tour of production side of the business which they found very impressive.

## **Gardening Tips for June**

Normally June would be the month for feeding all those bedding plants but most of us have only just put them in. With the polyanthus and the pansy looking so good it has been a dilemma whether to leave them or remove them to give the summer bedding a chance to flourish.

Vegetable plants are about 4 weeks behind with some very poor germination particularly with parsnips and carrots, but radish and lettuce will soon be ready; keep sowing some more for later crops. Put shading on the greenhouse to stop the plants from being scorched.

Finish dead heading daffodils, but don't be too hasty to remove the bulb foliage, they didn't flower until the end of March, so they will need longer to return the nutrients into the bulbs.

Apples will drop many small fruits this month – it's known as the June drop. Don't worry! It's nature's way of thinning out the crop. Gardeners can do even more thinning if a particularly heavy crop is being carried. This is easy on dwarf trees, but is not worth doing on large old standard trees.

June is the month for trimming box into those topiary shapes so whether it's a pyramid, a ball, or a peacock get cracking!

## **Lenham Swimming Club**

It is with great regret that the swimming pool at Swadelands School will be unable to open to the public again this summer and this will be the third year in a row. The pool has served residents of Lenham and the surrounding villages for many years.

Health and Safety in Swimming Pools requirements now specify that open swimming sessions must be supervised by a fully qualified pool lifeguard.

In order to continue operating next year (2014), we would need a number of individuals to come forward and be willing and able to undertake the Royal Life Saving Society Emergency Response (Pool) qualification and commit to a voluntary session at the Lenham pool one evening or a Saturday/Sunday per week during June, July and August. The qualification is a two-day course. There may be the opportunity to undertaken the full pool lifeguard qualification (5 day course). We also need helpers to be on the front desk to help take payments for swims and run the tuck shop.

We would like to thank those who previously expressed an interest in becoming involved. We still have your details and will making contact shortly (if you are able to update us with an e-mail address, we would be grateful). Unfortunately, the last appeal did not attract the minimum number of individuals needed to keep the club operating; hence our second attempt. At least ten lifeguards will be needed in addition to a similar number of helpers for the front desk.

Lenham Swimming Club opened every summer between 1977 and 2010 and will be a huge loss to the community if we are unable to continue operating. We have a very loyal but small team of volunteers who have given many hours of their time over the past 36 years. However, changes in health and safety legislation mean that formal qualifications are now also required.

Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age to undertake the qualification but there is no upper age limit. This could potentially create an ideal career opportunity and would be fully funded.

This is a final attempt to engage some volunteers. Aiming to re-open in 2014 will allow us time to put any volunteers through the lifeguard training course and mean that there would be a range of training dates for individuals to choose from in an attempt to accommodate volunteers' availability.

## **Up, Up and Away**

I always wanted to learn to fly... I'm one of those people who always looks at jets flying overhead at 35,000 ft and wonder which glamorous destination those lucky folks are on their way to. I blame Top Gun way back in the 80s for the most part, and kick myself for not having the drive to look into aviation as a career when I left school. It's always been something in the back of my mind and in 2011 my wife and I took a holiday to Barbados and stayed at a hotel close to final approach for the main airport on the island. For 2 weeks we watched large jets from around the globe come into land just a few hundred feet above the ocean. This finally flicked a switch in me and as soon as I got home I went up to Rochester airport and signed up for some training. 20 months, 7 written tests, one thorough medical, a cross-country solo flight and a skills test later and I'm now a qualified pilot.

For someone who finished university ever such a long time ago, it's quite an experience to cram for tests again, and there's an immense number of details you need to remember, but it's definitely worth it. I'm qualified to fly a single engine piston airplane – the small planes we often see flying over the village on bright sunny days just a few thousand feet up. So far I'm only qualified to fly during the day and when I can see the ground below (and can work out where I am), but have plans to continue my training to expand my horizons. It's quite an experience flying one of these small aircraft. Forget the reassuring strength of a modern car – these planes are all about lightness with thin panels, dated equipment and minimal creature comforts. Part of the pre-takeoff process includes checking the weight of the aircraft to make sure that your combination of friends, their bags and a full tank of fuel doesn't take you over the maximum permitted take off weight. Imagine hiring a car and being told you can carry friends or luggage, but not both.

From the skies it's a wonderful experience getting away from the hustle and bustle of daily life, and a chance to take in the views of Kent. Most people are surprised to find out that looking out the window with a map in your hand is how you keep track of your location. But with clearly distinguishable landmarks such as the M2 bridge, the Ashford outlet centre and stunning Leeds Castle, visual navigation is a fun challenge. I'm continuing to fly from both Rochester and Headcorn and am so glad I didn't put off taking up this hobby any longer. Highly recommended for anyone else kicking themselves for leaving it too long and thinking it's too late. It really isn't. To the skies!

## A word of warning

I have recently visited a resident who has subscribed to a 'Lifeline'-like product. While it appears to work you would be expected to sign up for TEN YEARS. You also have to pay up front. If we assume that the monthly charge is £20 that equals a lot of money.

In most cases, if the cost is over £35 you must be given written notice that you have 7 days to cancel. If you are not, the seller could commit an offence.

If you are approached by traders do not sign anything or agree to purchase anything without discussing it with someone first. This could be family, friends or neighbours. You are welcome to ring me too. If you do need to call the police do so at the time. Obviously you should not put yourself at risk, but a description of the people and vehicle would be a great help.

If you need to contact traders please use the 'Buy with Confidence Scheme.' Details can be accessed online or through Citizens Advice Consumer Service.

# Harrietsham Network — Spot Scams, Stop Scams!

Scams are schemes to con you out of money. You may get a scam from a phone call, letter, email, text or through a knock at the door that comes out of the blue. May 2013 was Scams Awareness month. Citizens Advice and the Trading Standards service teamed up to raise awareness of this menace, help consumers to protect themselves and fight back against the scammers.

#### How can I spot a scam?

It's likely to be a scam if:

- the call, letter, email or text has come out of the blue
- you've never heard of the lottery or competition they are talking about
- you didn't buy a ticket so you can't win it!
- they are asking you to send money in advance
- they are saying you have to respond quickly, so you don't get time to think about it or ask family and friends before you decide
- they are telling you to keep it a secret
- they seem to be offering you something for nothing.

If it seems too good to be true – it probably is!

#### How can I protect myself better?

These are some things you can do:

- never give out contact details like your name, phone number or address to strangers or to people who should have this information already
- never give financial information or details of your identity, bank accounts or credit card to strangers or to the businesses that should already hold your details
- shred anything with your personal or bank details on don't just throw it away
- if in doubt, don't reply bin it, delete it or hang up
- say 'no thank you' politely and put the phone down if they persist
- take your time resist pressure to make a decision straight away
- never send money to someone you don't know
- walk away from job adverts that ask for money in advance
- ask friends, neighbours or family if an offer is likely to be a scam.

#### Fight back – take action to stop scams

Three things you can do to help tackle scams:

Report it If you have been scammed or think someone has tried to scam you, report it to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 or visit www.actionfraud. police.uk/contact-us. If you paid by debit or credit card, online banking or check, contact your bank or credit card company first.

<u>Get advice</u> Phone the Citizens Advice Consumer Service 08454 04 05 06. You can get advice and they can pass details of rogue traders to Trading Standards.

<u>Tell someone</u> Tip off a friend, neighbour or relative about any scams you become aware of.



## An update on the blanket project

I would like to thank everyone who has taken part in the blanket project, from the people who have knitted the squares, donated wool, sewn or crocheted them together to those who have offered storage space for them.

The 'Winterwarm' scheme will run again later this year. I am hoping to run an event in the autumn so that those in need can be offered assistance in good time. I now need to arrange the collection and storage of completed blankets in readiness for this.

If you have loose squares it would be a great help if they could be sewn or crocheted together as there is a very large backlog. Each square should measure 6 inches by 6 inches. If you are not able to do this can you arrange to get the loose squares to me or one of my colleagues by the end of June.

I also need to collect any completed blankets by the end of August. Each blanket is made up of 36 6" squares and should therefore measure 3 feet by 3 feet.

A number of 'Winterwarm' events will be arranged to determine where the blankets need to go. If you know of someone who would appreciate one or who needs help or advice let us know and we will do our best to help.

There are Kent Community Wardens for Bearsted, Boughton Monchelsea, Chart Sutton, Coxheath, Harrietsham, Headcorn, Lenham, Loose, Marden and Staplehurst. In addition, apart from a supervisor, there is a warden available to attend communities in the Maidstone area who do not currently have a warden of their own.

# Cookery Corner

## **Spring Onion and Stilton Flan**

1 pack short crust pastry
1 bunch spring onions
1 tablespoon vegetable oil
5 ozs Stilton cheese, crumbled
2 eggs
7fl ozs milk

Heat the oven: 200°C/400°F/gas mark 6.

Line an 8" flan tin with the pastry, prick the base with a fork and line with greaseproof paper; put some baking beans into the paper and cook for 8 minutes.

Remove the paper and return the pastry case to the oven to dry out. Reduce the oven to 180°C/375°F/gas mark 5.

Fry the onions in the oil to soften; cool and spread over the pastry case. Sprinkle over the cheese. Beat the eggs and the milk.and pour over the Stilton. Bake for about 30 minutes until golden and set. Serve warm.
