

Our January meeting consisted of an interesting illustrated talk by Jane Scotchmer on Grottos, covering their history, mystery and quirky locations. This was followed by our AGM; David Oversby was re-elected Chairman and the remainder of the existing Committee were also re-elected, with the addition of Christine Bone. Fees for next year will be a flat £10 annual membership plus £1 per meeting attended. This represents excellent value for money in these difficult times.

Now for keeping warm for free. I can easily think of three ways:

The first has to be do a bit of gardening, digging, forking borders, sweeping leaves, pruning, vigorously brushing the paths or patio, forking over the lawn to improve aeration and drainage, or, if you haven't got much garden, playing musical chairs by rearranging all the pots and containers. These are all really good exercise, will increase your heart rate and after working up a good sweat you are guaranteed, when you walk back in afterwards to shout out 'turn that heating down, it's like an oven in here!'

Secondly growing a few vegetables, in containers if you have haven't got much garden, can result in a daily rota of leek soup, onion soup, carrot soup, squash soup, celeriac soup, potato soup and parsnip soup, or any combination, all really warming and bound to keep the cold out, plus you have that warm glow of satisfaction that you're eating something you've grown.

The third way of keeping warm once you've taken up gardening is that you can order and pay for in advance a green waste bin from Maidstone Borough Council, then go into a heated incandescent rage every other month or so when they fail to collect it and just say collections are not guaranteed and it's due to driver shortage!

Finally our next meeting will be on 21 March, back to our 7.30p.m.evening slot and will be the Spring show. Members will be exhibiting their Daffodils and other plants of interest. The Schedule is available now, see our Facebook page, so if you want to have a go or just come along to look we always welcome new members.

Parish Council Elections Thursday May 4th 2023

Why not become a Parish Councillor?

What does being a Parish Councillor involve?

Parish Councillors are the champions of their community, investing time in local projects and issues to the benefit of residents and the neighbourhood. Councillors attend to local needs of residents, local groups and businesses, make decisions on local services, collaborate with the Borough and County Councils to identify local needs, and progress vital projects to invest in the future of the community. The Parish Council, as a whole, makes a real difference to local people's lives – many things you will see day to day, but some are less known!

Each Parish Council, and the services they offer, is different. Here in Harrietsham we are responsible for most of the village open spaces, the play area on the Glebe Field, we arrange a seasonal hedge cutting scheme and village litter picks.

Members individually bring different skills and experience to the Team, which helps contribute to a good balanced representation of the Parish. A Councillor's main role is to participate in the collective decision-making process of the Council. Councillors help develop strategies and plans for the area and the Parish Council has a variety of Committee that specialise in certain areas. These include Environmental, Finance and Highways, which recommendations to the Full Council for decisions to be made. The Parish Council is a statutory consultee for planning applications and is heavily involved in Local Plan consultations and planning appeals. There are also light-hearted and fun community events that the Parish Council oversees, including the annual Big Lunch and Santa's Grotto! The Parish Council works with, and supports, local community groups which benefit the whole of the village.

Parish Councils are the most effective tier of Local Government, as we understand the needs of the Parishioners and Councillors are elected to represent their views. Councillors need to be enthusiastic and have a passion for wanting to help the community, but also able to work constructively as a member of the teams.

Whilst many think of becoming a Councillor as being a voluntary role, you actually become a holder of Public Office and with this comes great responsibility. All Councillors must abide by a strict Code of Conduct, which covers the seven principles of Public Life (Selflessness, Integrity, Objectivity, Accountability, Openness, Honesty and Leadership). If you would be interested in becoming a Parish Councillor, you must meet the following criteria to apply:

- · Be on the electoral register
- · Be over 18 years of age
- Be an owner or tenant within 3 miles of the Parish Council's area

Councillors do need to be able to have some flexibility as some Council and other meetings with outside bodies (such as Kent Highways) can take place during the day. Full Council meetings are held on the last Wednesday of the Month (except in August and December), with an Annual Parish Meeting also being held in April. KALC offers a wide range of courses to support you in the role and the Clerk will always be able to help with arranging this.

If you would be interested in finding out more about the role, our Parish Council advisers, the Kent Association for Local Councils (KALC) have established a free online awareness event on the 21st March 2023 (7-8pm). This is a good opportunity for you to ask any questions you may have and you can sign up through the following link:

Borough Council Corner

We all need photo ID to vote in future

All voters attending polling stations will now need to show photographic identification before they receive their ballot paper to vote.

New legislation now requires ID to be shown at the next local elections in May. The government have introduced this new policy with the reasoning that it will stamp out any potential fraud taking place.

In our experience we have never encountered any fraud in nearly 30 years of elections and the UK has very low levels of proven electoral fraud. However this will be the rule for this year's elections. Local Elections will take place on Thursday 4 May 2023, a valid form of photo ID will be needed to cast your vote.

There will be a wide range of photographic identification which will be acceptable at polling stations which include:

- 1. Drivers' licences
- 2. Passports
- 3. Some concessionary travel passes
- 4. Proof of Age cards
- 5. Ministry of Defence identity cards
- 6. Photocard parking permits issued as part of the Blue Badge scheme
- 7. Free Voter Cards, provided by local authorities

Expired photographic identification will also be accepted if the photograph is of a good enough likeness to allow polling station staff to confirm the identity of the holder.

Anyone in Maidstone who is registered but does not have one of the approved types of photo ID will be able to get a free Voter Card from Maidstone Borough Council from. For more details of how to apply from MBC ring 01622 602000 or make an application by going to: www.electoralcommission.org.uk

Lenham WI

In January our speaker was James Lee who told us all about his career in the British Army. His talk was entitled a Tour of Afghanistan. However, he joined the Army on 5 August 1989 with the Royal Corp of Transport and travelled to most European countries, China, Canada, Nepal, Malaysia and the USA, spent time in the Gulf and then back to Northern Ireland. He then went on to Yugoslavia and worked under the NATO banner to implement peace and then back to Southampton, Folkestone, Cyprus, Jordan, Israel and Germany. His last tour of duty before Afghanistan was in Iraq where he spent time working on the logistics of moving 8,000 troops out of Iraq. He was one of the last 200 to leave.



In 2001 an opportunity came up to go to Kandahar Airfield in Afghanistan for six months moving goods and soldiers in and out of the country. The base was built in the mid 1950's by the USA; the Soviets used it from 1979 to 1989 after which it was under the control of the Soviet Russian-backed government until 1992. The next owners were the Taliban until the Americans came back in 2001 on Operation Enduring Freedom and promptly evicted them with several tonnes of heavy ordnance. He described his job of bringing equipment, vehicles and generators into Kandahar Airfield as similar to budget airline check-in staff but with guns and with damaged equipment and vehicles being dumped there. It was dangerous at night as there were no street lights and always the threat of kidnap. The population was around 30,000 – mostly Americans but also Bulgarians and Romanians who worked in security and the police and Spanish who repaired the infrastructure etc. The Taliban would fire rockets every few days. Radar would pick them up with only 3 second warnings to take cover. There were 10,000 troops in Afghanistan – 2,000 front line troops and 8,000 troops to support them.





Contact with home was through email, phone calls and letters although when a soldier was killed the internet was taken down to ensure the family would not hear about it before being told officially. He returned home after 6 months and he was amazed how everything was carrying on as normal. He left the Army on 5 August 2013, exactly 24 years after signing up. He decided to carve out a career in aviation. So he learnt to fly and then qualified as a flying instructor. A nine to five job is not for him. He has now written a book – "Licking the Taliban's Flip Flop" telling of his time in Afghanistan, of the work he was doing and the friends he made. I'm looking forward to reading it.



This month we have Dee Larcombe telling us about "Five Years Living and Nursing in India". We certainly have an international flavour to our meetings. March also sees our Federation Annual General Meeting held in Tunbridge Wells. The speaker this year is Rev Kate Bottley who has appeared on Songs of Praise, The One Show, Sunday Morning Live and is currently presenting Good Morning Sunday on Radio 2.

How would you introduce yourself to a stranger in ten words or less? You might like to think about it now...

How each of us answers that question tells the other person, and ourselves, so much about what we think is important about ourselves and our identity. You might say, "I am the son (or daughter) of somebody important, or "I am Fred and I have always lived in Grafty Green" (apologies Fred if you're out there), or "I'm Rachel and I'm a computer programmer", or "I'm Jo and I go to such and such a school", and so on. So, is inheritance or location or our job or our school what defines our identity?

Identity, and how you find it, is a really big deal these days. Bookshops are still brimming with books about how to find ourselves, and for younger folk especially, appearance and social media profile can mean everything. Sexuality and gender are also key factors for us all.

But for Christians, our identity is located deeply in the love of Jesus. In the Len Valley Benefice our verse for the year is, "In Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith". What does this mean? It means that by receiving the love of God we are free to be secure in whom we are. We are people who know that God loves us, warts and all. We are beloved, like the best-loved child. That means that we can be free to love others, whether the 'other' has the same inheritance, is from the same location, does the same job and so on.

None of this means that all those other things about identity are unimportant, but it does mean that deep within our being, our personality, there can be a security from which everything else flows.

It also doesn't mean that this is just 'easy'. Learning that we're loved and learning to love is a life's work. Why don't you join us? What could be a better mission in life?
