Your Church Needs You



Let me start by saying straight away that this article has been written because the Friends of the Church of St. John the Baptist needs more active members! Without them, there is a chance that the Friends will cease this year! We are desperately short of active members, as well as a secretary.

The Friends is a secular organisation concerned with raising money to maintain and improve the Grade 1 Listed church for the benefit of ALL the people of Harrietsham, now and in the future. Whilst it is true that the Friends work with the church authorities, we are independent of them being a registered charity formed in 2001 and concerned with the building itself.

Since our formation, the Friends' fundraising efforts have enabled us to support several projects. Between 2017 and 2020, the Friends provided funding of £25,600 towards a new internal toilet and kitchen replacing the Victorian lean-to outside toilet attached to the north of the church. Previously, we had been able to fund a new organ (£26,000), provision of disabled access (£3,900), internal redecoration of the north and south aisles (£4,700) and the installation of glass entrance doors (£13,000). More recently we have funded the repairs to the weathervane (£6,000) and repointing of the brickwork (£2,050).

However, without more active members willing to join our management committee, we probably will be unable to continue our regular activities in the future and may have to cease raising money for the church separately from the diocese.

Borough council corner

You may have read that Kent County Council has warned that pressure on its budget means many road repair and maintenance schemes will be suspended. We are continuing to report and monitor potholes inspite of this KCC position as it allows a claim to be made.

Whilst driving and walking we also report damaged signs, flytipping, over hanging trees and other issues that may cause problems for residents whether walking, running, cycling, horse riding or driving. Over the last year we reported nearly 400 issues.

We recently found that two access chambers at the rear if Lenmead on the public right of way were only covered with a piece wood, this was obviously of some concern. After contacting the relevant Public Rights Of Way (PROW) officer they were repaired to make safe.

Many villagers are aware that the Harrietsham & Lenham ward has been significantly increased in size and now takes in Hollingbourne and the surrounding north downs parishes. It will become a 3 member ward (represented by 3 Borough Councillors). For more details and maps showing the area go to www.hl-nd.co.uk

From the Trustees of the Culpepper Charity

We hope that you will have seen our adverts in this magazine over the last few months. We would especially like to thank the Harrietsham Fish Scheme and its Network editorial team for allowing the advertisements to be placed without charge.

Since the Charity was re-launched in November 2022, we have provided eight grants totalling just under £4,000, to people in Harrietsham for heating, food and other financial needs. We have been surprised by the low number of Grant applications received: less than we had expected. We hope that this is due to the people of Harrietsham not needing our financial assistance rather than hesitancy on the part of would-be applicants. However, we have, so far, not turned down a single application.

If you are having trouble making your income stretch to meet your necessary expenditure, do consider requesting financial help from the Culpepper Charity and ask us for a Grant Application Form. You do not have to be receiving state benefits to receive help from the Charity. Rest assured, every Grant is considered individually by all the Trustees and everything is done anonymously. Only the Trustees know to whom Grants are paid, and our Data Protection policy specifically requires that names of applicants are not publicised in anyway.





Jesus is coming back soon!

In the days when the disciples lived in Galilee, weddings took a different form to what it is today. When a young man wanted to get married, he would first speak with his father about the young lady that he had in mind. They would then both go to see the young lady and her father. Discussions would take place and eventually an agreement made to allow a wedding to take place. The only person who knew when the ceremony would take place was the young man's father.

The young man would return home, and he would then set about building a home for his intended bride. Young lady would spend time searching out the best materials for the wedding attire.

When Jesus told his disciples that he was going away he told him that he was going to "prepare a place for them," so that where he was, they would be able to live with him. Read St John 14 vv 1-3. When His disciples asked Jesus when He would return, he told them *that no one knows when that will be – only His Father*. Read Mark ch 13 v 32. Can you see the parallel with the wedding procedure outlined earlier?

What we do know is that Jesus gave some signs indicating that his return would be imminent. One of these is that many false prophets and false people claiming to be Jesus would appear.

Charles Manson claimed that he was Christ. Jim Jones convinced his followers that he spoke for Jesus. There was also David Koresh. He and his followers tragically lost their lives in the destruction of their compound in Waco, Texas

Jesus also spoke of wars and rumours of wars. Excluding World Wars 1 and 2, we have several wars on going today. I do not need to remind you of the war between Russia and Ukraine. Then we have wars in the Middle East between Israel and Hamas. Iran and Pakistan have exchanged missiles, Houthi rebels have been fighting missiles on shipping in the Red Sea. North Korea is posturing for war against South Korea; there is also conflict in East Asia between China and Taiwan. Read Matthew ch 24 vy 1-26. Hout6his

Read Luke 21:11, 31. Here Jesus speaks of great earthquakes and pestilences. Just cast your mind back to 2020 when the world was infested with COVID. There have also been many earthquakes in the Middle East and Far East with deadly consequences. According to the U.S. Geological Survey, hundreds of thousands of people have died in earthquakes around the world since the year 2000.

Jesus also predicted that "lawlessness will abound and the love of many will grow cold." Read Matthew ch 24 v 12. As far as lawlessness is concerned, we are certainly seeing that there is a rise in this in our own country where murder is an all too frequent mention on the daily news. By the second part of the verse, this means that spiritual appetite of people the world over will decrease. It is obvious that this certainly applies in the UK, when church attendance has declined alarmingly. Need I say anymore?

Surely these signs are telling us that we are living in the last days before Jesus will return. So, what must we do? The parable of the five wise and five foolish virgins tells us how important it is that we keep "oil" in our lamps. Some of you may have heard of this song "Give me oil in my lamp keep me burning." This has reference to the wedding in Galilee referred to earlier. Virgins were to go with the wedding party to the venue. As they did not know when it was to take place, it was vitally important that they were prepared and ready. So, it is for us as well, and we must keep short accounts with God about our spiritual failings to ensure that we are ready too.




