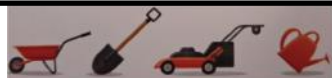

Parish Council News

Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Wednesday 30 April at 8.00pm in the Booth Hall. This will follow the monthly Parish Council meeting, which will be a shorter than usual meeting. All residents are welcome to attend both meetings.

Update on the New Burial Ground

Residents will have noticed that Harrietsham Parish Council has undertaken excavation work on the land behind the Church – known as the New Burial Ground.

This included an extensive geophysical survey following which a number of deep trenches were dug. The archaeological survey yielded an interesting and complex mix of archaeology involving Iron Age, Roman, Saxon and possibly early medieval remains. The highlights include one ring ditch, probably used to drain an Iron Age round house, one human cremation and two human burials. The work is now complete and we are awaiting confirmation of the ages of the human remains. Following further extensive archaeological surveying, the remains have now been reburied and must not be disturbed.

Meanwhile, disappointingly, it has come to our notice that there is evidence of unauthorised metal detection having been carried out. The New Burial Ground is the property of the Parish Council and permission has not been granted for this activity. The Parish Council wishes to make it clear to those responsible that permission will not be granted in the future and, furthermore, the Parish Council will take action against anyone carrying out unauthorised activity on what is deemed to be an ancient burial ground.

Harrietsham History Society



The petrol station located on the corner of West Street and Station Road in Harrietsham, Kent boasts an interesting history. A grade II listed building means it is recognized for its special architecture and/or historic interest. It was first listed on the National Heritage List for England on April 26, 1968.

The petrol pumps no longer fuel travellers heading towards London or the Channel ports, but over the years, would have served as a vital refuelling point for motorists and both the petrol station and the adjoining garage on West Street boast a rich motoring heritage that stretches back over a century.

The original business was established in 1910, making it one of the oldest garages in Britain and the building has been in constant use ever since. Throughout its history, it has commanded a certain presence and provides a tangible link to the past. In its early days it served as both a petrol station—with original petrol pumps (now refurbished) — and a traditional country garage complete with workbenches and shelves. This long-standing facility is recognised as one of the oldest of its kind still in operation in Kent.



Fast forward to the early 1960s, when a new chapter began. In 1962, Julian Kingsford-Booty founded the Vintage Sports Car Garage in Lenham Square. By 1967, the business had relocated to Harrietsham. With this move came a rebranding and evolution into what later became known as the Lenham Motor Company (or Lenham Sportscars). This enterprise built its reputation by modifying and restoring classic sports cars—often working on Austin-Healey Sprites and Healey models—and even producing bespoke sports and racing vehicles.

Today the site on West Street remains a tangible link to the early days of motoring in Kent. Although the petrol pumps no longer serve fuel, their refurbishment preserves a key part of the building's historic charm. The garage itself stands as a testament to the ingenuity and passion of local motoring pioneers and has contributed significantly to the regional legacy of automotive design and motorsport.

Together, the petrol station and the Lenham Sport Car Garage illustrate a seamless blend of early 20th century utility and later bespoke automotive craftsmanship—a history that continues to be celebrated by enthusiasts and heritage bodies alike. The building is now occupied by Southern Lightning Engineers Limited. They have undertaken a restoration job on the two original pumps. Ensuring the history of this important part of village history is preserved for future generations.

Update from your local MP Helen Whately

Faversham and Mid Kent is under siege from development. This is the number one topic people raise with me at the moment.

There are currently five large developments in the pipeline across Faversham and Mid Kent. If they all go ahead the number of people living here will increase by more than the population of Faversham. I don't need to tell you that this will completely change the rural character of our area.

Before the General Election I lobbied successfully to change national planning policy to focus development in cities and urban areas. The plan was to raise density levels in inner London to those of European cities like Paris and Barcelona, build more homes on brownfield land in urban areas and regenerate parts of Leeds, Liverpool and York.

The new Government is reversing this. They have cut London's housing targets, and they are pushing more housing into rural parts of the South East like Kent.

I've always said I understand the need for more housing, and I know people need a roof over their head, but this scale of development in our countryside is something else altogether.

Before Christmas I introduced a new Bill in Parliament which aims to protect high quality land for farming. It's very hard for a Private Members Bill to become law, but if I succeed, it will stop large developments being built on Grade 1 agricultural land. We need our best farmland to be used for growing food, not houses.

In November, I was shocked when the Deputy Prime Minister took away Swale Borough Council's power to decide whether the Highsted Park development (8,400 new homes) should go ahead. That happened literally hours before a meeting when local councillors intended to reject the application; instead, the decision will be made in Whitehall.

It's hard to turn around the juggernaut of the UK Government, but there's still a fight to be fought. We are lucky to have committed campaigners who have set up groups to do just that. Four of the local groups are: Against Lidsing Garden Development, Save Our Heath Lands, Stop Winterbourne Fields and Stop Highsted Park Action Group. Apologies if I have missed campaign groups off this list – if so please do let me know.

With so much development coming locally, everyone is going to be affected. Even if there's no new housing planned in your parish, all the roads are going to get busier, along with more demand for local public services like doctors and dentists.

So can I urge you to get involved and support one of the local campaigns fighting these massive developments. You can find out more about them by searching online or check my website –www.helenwhately.org.uk for links.

Lenham WI

In February Kim White OBE came to give us a talk about the Gypsy Traveller Culture. The Romany Gypsies originally came from India and brought with them the bright coloured clothing and the gold and silver jewellery that they still identify with today. They travelled from India through Asia and Europe selling their wares, holding horse races and markets.

From the cradle to the grave the father is the dominant figure in the family. The men do not do women's work or take any interest in childbirth. When a child is born the boys are very often given the same name while the girls take their grandmother's name. Consequently there could be quite a few Johns in the same family. Some boys will change their surname to their mother's maiden name to keep that name going and very few travellers have birth certificates. They are unable to read or write so many babies are not registered and the families do not claim benefits. Boys go out to work with their fathers from the age of 15 or even younger whilst the girls learn about the cleanliness of the home. From the age of 8 they help with the babies and the younger children and they learn to cook. Whilst travelling they used to be able to stop on common land but since 1968 all common land now belongs to the crown. The second largest traveller community in the country is a council owned gypsy site in Kent, one of only 12, although there are 261 actual sites.

Wedding invitations are by word of mouth and now, with social media, people come from miles around to attend. When a traveller dies a cordon is placed around the place of death to ward off evil spirits. Kim has experienced a gathering in hospital where vehicles were parked around the public car park causing chaos and the visiting family were all crowded around the bed. The nurse in charge tried to speak to the next of kin, which was the wife, to tell her that only two visitors at a time were allowed. She did nothing about it because she was a woman and the men would have taken no notice of her. The nurse should have spoken to the head of the family, the father, the son or brother who would then tell the family that they would have to leave. Every gypsy family must be represented at the funeral and that is why so many women and children also attend.

This month we have Pamela Gillard who will be giving us a talk on Patchwork and Quilting. The WI was originally started to help women and girls to learn about the skills they need to run a home – cooking and sewing. Education has been a continued aim of the WI and still forms the basis of all the events and workshops.

Christian Message

Hope, Expectation and Joy. A Christian message for Easter.

I was thrilled to see that this year I have been asked to write the Easter Christian Message – thrilled and a little overwhelmed at where to start and how best to talk about this important Christian festival.

In December my daughter sent me a photograph of a shelf in her local supermarket. “Outrageous!” I exclaimed, when I saw that they were selling crème eggs before we had even celebrated Christ’s birth. “Yes indeed,” she replied, “they have more than doubled in price this year!” Hey ho, I suppose everything depends on our own perspective.

As I sit here on a cold, wet, misty February morning, I feel a glimmer of hope as I think about April, sunny Spring weather, daffodils and bird song. From the perspective of a nature lover, April is full of hope, expectation and joy.

By 1 April, we will be half way through Lent. Many of us will have given something up or taken challenges on and will have failed, excelled, or a bit of both. Most of us will be looking forward to 20 April and the chance to relax and indulge in at least one ‘over-priced’ chocolate item. More hope, expectation and joy.

For Christians, Lent is important. It is a time of reflecting on our own faith, the amazing example set by Jesus when he lived here on earth, the incredible sacrifice he made for us all by dying to save us from sin and his resurrection to show he had conquered death and was returning to his father in heaven. Yes, you guessed it, even more hope, expectation and joy, but let’s explore this a little more:

During this time, we have a chance to think about God’s love for each of us, the chance to meet him, through Jesus, in this life, and the certainty of meeting him in the next. Jesus’s ministry was very short but in about three years he packed in more teaching, healing and, ultimately, suffering, than many of us experience in a lifetime. His greatest message was one of Love. Love your family, friends, neighbours and even your enemies. That’s a real challenge: It’s hard enough for us to forgive those who hurt us, lie to us or betray us, but for those experiencing a war-torn environment with serious injury, multiple bereavements or continuing hunger, it must, at times, seem an unfathomable trial. Those who do manage to carry on and still show love, are heroes indeed, and reflect the love Christ had for us all.

Everywhere Jesus went he banished suffering and gave hope. As the time of his death drew near, he tried to prepare his disciples with expectation for his sacrifice of dying on the cross. If we ask Jesus into our lives and ask for forgiveness for all our wrong doing, we can enjoy a personal relationship with him where he will guide and protect us, and we can live in the knowledge that we have a place in heaven without fear of judgement. Jesus’ resurrection proved his victory over sin and death and left a legacy of joy for us all. This offer hasn’t doubled in price in over 2,000 years. It is still free to us today. We only have to ask.
