Knit, Crochet and Natter

We had no meeting of Knit, Crochet and Natter in December as it was too near Christmas, but at the time of writing we are looking forward to our second meeting in January. The first meeting in November went extremely well. Some people brought along their own projects to work on and some took part in the charity projects. One lady who had never crocheted before was taught the basics by another and went home with a new skill. The charity projects we are working on at the moment are twiddlemuffs and crocheted giraffes. We are making the twiddlemuffs for anyone with dementia who might like one or for children with attention deficit disorder who might benefit from them. They are muffs with colour and texture that can be knitted, crocheted, or indeed, sewn. From what I've read, they work where there are restless hands due to anxiety, by calming the user, who feels the different textures both inside and outside of the muff. They can be knitted or crocheted in simple stitches with beads, buttons, ribbons, etc, added for texture or they can be purposely composed of different heavily textured knitting patterns and bits and bobs added for extra texture. We have plenty of yarn that was donated for charity knitting to make these with. We also have kits that were donated by Julie for the crocheted giraffes and the finished giraffes will be added to our charity sales table when we have enough handcrafted items for sale.

Our next meeting will be held on 27 February between 2-4pm at Harrietsham Village Hall. If you would like to join us, please feel very welcome to come along. Maybe you would like to join in with one of our charity projects or perhaps you would prefer to work on your own project. Some of you might not have knitted or crocheted before and would like to learn or to improve the skills you already have or perhaps you need help with a project that you have got stuck on. Maybe you just want to come along to relax and socialise and that's okay, too. Fees are £3-£4 per person (depending on numbers) and this fee covers the cost of the hire of the hall, tea, coffee and cake which are always served. Any questions, please contact me on 01622 851885.

Maidstone Borough Council

At the full council meeting on December 18, Janetta and Cllr Eddie Powell submitted a motion concerning MBC's apparent acceptance of potentially 10,000 additional homes as part of the local Plan review. In short, the Borough Council has accepted a position of nearly 30,000 homes up to the year 2037. We called for a temporary suspension of the review to properly analyse the housing yet to be built in the Borough. The stance taken was to push the council to realise it must do something to challenge the numbers being placed by central government. The council leader Cllr Cox had promised previously to write in conjunction with leader of opposition Cllr Perry to challenge these numbers but nothing had been penned. So the motion was submitted and supported by the majority of Councillors. Time will tell if anything is obtained by this position.

Following the meeting we withdrew our support from the administration led by Cllr Cox.

Christian Message

The following is an extract from our new Bishop's address at her installation in Canterbury Cathedral on November 30th.

'Let us think what it might look like for us in Kent if the name of Jesus enabled us to be a unifying body. That instead of focussing on the things that separate us, we focussed on the things we share in common. What if we were to recognise his presence as we seek to ensure that the resources we have been blessed with are not for amassing personal wealth but to be shared in such a way that our brothers and sisters in poverty are no longer in need'.

Bishop Rose continued, "God's presence in our midst changes the kind of relationship we have with Him and with each other. This is at the heart of the 'Good News' message we are called to share. We are deeply mistaken if the kind of relationship we seek with God is so personal and private that we exclude our brothers and sisters around us or, indeed, as we are in Kent on the frontier, if we exclude our brothers and sisters from one another.

If we are going to experience the oneness of purpose that Jesus prayed for then we will need to be identified more with the name of Jesus. For too long we have been embarrassed to be associated with him. We have kept him hidden in our beautiful churches and cathedrals that we visit on our terms, for weddings, baptisms, funerals or other such special occasions like Christmas or the mandatory school service. If we are going to ignite the communities from which we come, indeed the county of Kent, then everyone of us will need to reassess our relationship with the name Jesus.'

The Bishop challenged those in the cathedral to think about how they might share the Gospel in a natural way on social media; challenge policy makers and make decisions that will help their community.

There will be an opportunity to meet Bishop Rose in St Mary's Church, Lenham, on Sunday June 28. Do come!



Top Tips by Harrietsham Gardening Society

February is the month for really getting things going in the garden or greenhouse to ensure all the benefits of a lovely Spring/Summer garden which is the envy of the neighbours. I'm sure they'll be really disappointed when they see your parsnips and a few early potatoes are already in!! Parsnips take at least 6 weeks to germinate so don't be despondent if they take some time to appear. They are one of the few vegetables where you must sow fresh seed every year; the seed loses its viability very quickly so throw any left over from last year away. What's better too than a few new potatoes from the garden? Plant a few the last week of this month outside and you're almost guaranteed to be able to lift a few the second week in June; certainly you will if you've put two or three singly in large pots in the greenhouse. Waiting until they've flowered etc. before lifting is a load of old baloney, keep having a look in early June and they're ready as soon as they're big enough. Don't forget the butter and fresh mint....

Late this month too is time to get a few tomatoes going. Do buy proprietary seed compost though, so much ubiquitous compost is sold these days which is said to be 'suitable for cuttings, potting or seeds' What a load of rubbish as some of it can genuinely be rubbish. Whilst we all support recycling etc. trying to grow very fine seeds in compost which is lumpy with bits of twig and bark, for example, is a recipe for disaster. Seed compost, which even then should be sieved is the order of the day for fine seeds.

Snowdrops, snowdrops and more snowdrops. Aren't we lucky that the first signs are appearing that winter is on its way out as these little jewels arrive, however hard the weather. Don't forget, if you want to increase their numbers elsewhere in the garden to lift with a fork and divide them as soon as flowering has finished and they are still as they say 'in the green'. You will have so much more success than planting frizzled up bulbs next autumn.

Candlemas day, 2nd February, will be upon us as you read this. I wonder if the following old rhyme will hold this year?

"If Candlemas day be fair and bright Winter will have another flight But if it be dark with clouds and rain Winter is gone and will not come again"

Having got the 2nd out of the way, the 3rd is the day of the Feast of St Blaise, the patron saint of people afflicted by throat complaints. Probably a good time to hold it being still the cold and 'flu season. Apparently there is an annual ceremony at St Ethelred's church in London where sufferers' throats are touched by two candles (not four/fork handles – thanks to Ronnie Barker even if this is the gardening bit) which cures them. It probably does if they're lit and held too close!! Perhaps we

should stick to the proven benefits of raw onions which contain sulphur and allegedly help break up mucus, also they allegedly have antibacterial and antiviral properties. Now, that means do what they do commercially and if you're not planting onion sets sow onions to be grown from seed outdoors the last week or so in February, on Shrove Tuesday, 25 February.

On 14 February we have Valentines day so let's hope there are plenty of narcissi and daffodils around which if not of the quality or exotic appeal expected might mean on Shrove Tuesday, 25 February no pancakes (or perhaps the batter rather than the finished article). Don't forget to include the old folk lore poem with your bunch of crocuses or whatever else is to hand:

If apples were pears
And peaches were plums
And the rose had a different name
If tigers were bears
And fingers were thumbs
I'd love you just the same
