


Harrietsham Village Hall Trust

Craft and Chat

By the time you read this, we will have had our December meetings of Craft and Chat and Crafternoon offering the opportunity to make Christmas baubles or Bottlecap Christmas Tree Wall Hangings or continue with unfinished projects, and also our Christmas Get Together which, in 2019, due to an increase in numbers will have been held at Harrietsham Village Hall rather than at my home. This is always a joyous time when we meet to celebrate our crafting friendships for another year, bring along a crafting project, get served savoury and sweet Christmas fayre as well as red or white wine, Bucks' Fizz, soft drinks, coffee or tea and sing along to Christmas music when we are not chatting!

January's Craft and Chat meeting will be held on Saturday 4 between 1-4pm in Harrietsham Village Hall and we will be continuing the crazy patchwork pincushions that were started at a previous meeting. We will be doing surface embroidery on the seams and silk ribbon embroidery in the centre as well as adding any lace motifs or other embellishments we wish to add including beads. For this stage, you will need to bring some perle/pearl cottons in size 8 (alternatively, you can use stranded cottons), usual sewing kit – needles, scissors, pins, etc – please remember to include some chenille needles as we will need these for the silk ribbon embroidery. You will also need some stuffing, a couple of old CDs (if you don't have these, please let me know), a piece of plain white cotton fabric and a piece of felt (both the size of a CD) and some trim to go around the pincushion. If you wish to add lace motifs, beads or other embellishments, please bring these along, too. Craft and Chat will be providing the silk ribbon for the silk ribbon embroidery and members have already been asked what colour they require as I wanted to order it before Christmas.

January's Crafternoon meeting will be held on Thursday 16 between 2-4pm in Harrietsham Village Hall. The project hasn't been decided upon yet but possibly we might be experimenting with zipper brooches (brooches made with zips). 



Top Tips by Harrietsham Gardening Society

Gardening in January – of course you can! There's always a job you can find to do. A quick whip round the indoor plants, removing any dead or dying leaves and if they're too big for potting on, removing a few cms of compost from the top of the pot and replacing with fresh can give them a whole new lease of life. It's important to watch the watering of course, ideally not too much in the winter months but after all the heat and excitement of Christmas they can easily be forgotten too. If you're really stuck for a job and someone in the family needs a haircut you can always pretend you're doing a bit of topiary, most easy to fulfill your ambitions in that direction if they're asleep at the time of course!

If you are lucky enough to have a greenhouse, a good wash of the inside and outside can be very beneficial and eliminate a lot of otherwise overwintering pests and diseases, as well as ensuring as much light transmission as possible takes place to avoid those new seedlings becoming soft and leggy as they struggle up to the light. A long-handled soft broom can be very useful with a bucketful of household detergent and/or disinfectant completing the kit. Do remember to put some rubber bands around your wrists when doing the underside of the roof as a cold solution of Jeyes fluid trickling down to your armpits isn't the most pleasant experience for you or anyone else. While you're at it soaking your garden canes, seed trays and plant pots in a solution of disinfectant is also a good idea. You will be really enjoying yourself by now and the dog will have run a mile!

January is, of course, also a good time to start the year as you mean to go on. Cleaning, sharpening and oiling all the garden tools; bags of compost or this and that in the shed or spare bedroom will make things a lot easier once the season starts. It's also a good idea to sort through all those half-empty packets of seeds which ideally should be thrown away. Unless they've been kept in an airtight container under constant cool temperatures such as in a fridge their viability will be very much diminished and even if they do germinate the seedlings may well struggle to survive.

In order to head off that SAD syndrome in January when it's a lovely bright day and you need a warm up this is the ideal month for doing some really hard pruning. Apples, in particular, but not plums, can benefit from some removal of overcrowding branches which should result in much larger fruit next summer/autumn. Do cut back to a main trunk or branch though otherwise the trees will end up looking like a lot of clothes hangers in a hall. Certain other shrubs and hedges can also benefit from a hard winter prune, best to make sure you know which though or you could cut off the flowering wood and end up with a load of foliage and nothing else next spring/ summer. That's a good point to end on; why not join the Society this year and hear our expert speakers or join our visits?
