We're delighted to start 2021 back in the heart of the village, settled into our temporary home at St John's church (or 'the castle', as some of our children call it!)

As many of you know, this time six months ago the fate of the preschool was looking increasingly uncertain as we tried to find a venue for the new school year. As September grew closer and we were still without a home, we were very much in need of a miracle - so it seems fitting that it was the church who stepped in with a solution! We're grateful to the PCC who have been so willing to accommodate the requirements of our growing preschool within their ancient, Grade 1 listed building. It's a unique and beautiful setting, and we've been pleasantly surprised by how well the space works for our children and our staff team.

Working towards a 'forever home' for the preschool is still very much in our sights, but for now we can focus on what we're here to do: providing an exciting, nurturing environment for the children. Despite the additional challenges of COVID, the hard work of our brilliant team meant that the autumn 2020 term was a real success; we've had dinosaurs, dancing, a great deal of craft and as much time playing outside as the weather would allow. All our children have learnt new things, grown in confidence and made positive memories. We asked them to share their thoughts on the autumn term:

What have you enjoyed about preschool?

'Playing with my friends! And playing with trucks and trains'

'Playing with blocks and bricks and cars and ponies. And cars. And playdough. And one more thing - paint'

What have you learnt at preschool this term?

'Finding some shapes. The teachers help me if I get stuck with the toys'

'Writing my name and phonics'

'I always learn how to make stuff'

News from Harrietsham School

Following the summer break the school re-opened completely in September with all staff and children returning. This included the two new Reception classes with 22 children in each. Two new teachers also started in September, one in Year 6 and one in Year 1. Everyone seems to have settled down really well.

Stage 1 of the building work, the hall, kitchen and staff room extension was completed before the start of the academic year and Stage 2, the car park, finally finished by half term. Work then started on Stage 3, the building of the new classrooms, at the end of October and this is due to finish by the Summer of 2021. Many of you will see the results of all this work as you walk past the school.

Unfortunately, due to the pandemic, the process of appointing a new head had to be put on hold. However, we are extremely lucky that Mrs Waller Davies agreed to stay in this position for another year.

Due to the wonders of Zoom, Collective Worship has been able to continue. On Monday the whole school 'meets' together and on Thursday a member of the Len Valley Benefice team conducts the service. The children are getting used to this and, as I have observed when I join the Worship, they participate with great enthusiasm.

The children had a virtual Harvest Festival celebration with the theme of Growing Together and were encouraged to donate to an international charity 'Toilet Twinning'. They raised over £300 which has been used to fund a project to build a toilet block in Uganda.

The children also came to school on November 13 wearing clothes which made them feel happy and raised money for the Children in Need appeal.

Life certainly has not returned to normal and there have been several 'blips' during these past three months. However, the children have all adapted extremely well to the altered conditions and the staff continue to support them whether they are learning in school or at home. Thanks are due to Mrs Davies and all of the staff for maintaining 'business as usual' as much as possible.

Top Tips from Harrietsham Gardening Society

January already and time to get a few things moving ready to plant out in the Spring. If you haven't got a heated greenhouse, and very few people have these days, a heated propagator can be a real boon, but whatever you have it is light equally as much as warmth which is necessary to produce strong sturdy plants. A small seed tray or two on a well-lit windowsill can be perfectly adequate, but do avoid overwatering at this time of year as 'damping-off' disease can be very damaging. This occurs when a fungus which thrives in wet cold conditions creeps across the soil surface and small seedlings collapse at soil level. We used to be able to control this with a copper-based fungicide called Cheshunt compound but that, in common with most other effective pesticides, is no longer available. Cultural methods then, as previously mentioned, mean avoiding over-watering, providing plenty of light and buoyant air along with gentle warmth.

What should we be sowing now? Well on the vegetable front tomatoes, ideally individually in 3 inch pots as they otherwise get a check to growth when potted on, onions from seed, lettuces (Little gem is a good variety for early sowings) and summer cabbage such as Golden acre which will provide succulent hearts in June. As for flowers, dahlias from seed, begonias, pelargoniums, and sweet peas if you didn't get them sown in Autumn. Herbs such as Basil can also be sown now and chillies started off too.

As trees are well and truly dormant now, apples can be pruned and the other main outdoor job is finishing winter digging. That can be quite hard work. I heard about a chap whose son used to turn over his allotment for him but sadly he had been naughty and was now serving ten years at Her Majesty's pleasure. He felt very guilty that he couldn't dig the allotment over for his dad and confirmed it in a letter to him. He said, 'really sorry I can't do the digging this year, if you do manage to do it don't dig too deeply as that's where I buried some of the loot.' The next day a van full of police officers arrived at the allotment who turned over every inch. This was followed by another note from his son who said, 'Hope they left it reasonably level, it was the best I could do under the circumstances.'

Before you throw out the mistletoe this year why not think about growing some of your own? It is quite specific where it will grow, apple trees are the most likely host in a garden, but it will also grow on poplar and lime trees. It's best to keep the berries until March/April to make sure they are well and truly ripe. The best chance of success is to 'sow' these on an apple tree with crevices in the bark into which you can press the berry, or form a slit or flap with something like a Stanley knife and press the berries into that. The branch you choose wants to be at least 4 inches in girth and it's the underside which should be used as that is in the shade and helps prevent drying out of the berry. Wrapping an old bit of net curtain around the branch will avoid birds interfering with your endeavours. In nature the berries are a favourite food of thrushes and blackcaps who spread the seeds by wiping their beaks on branches – the seeds are also still viable after passing through their gut or when regurgitated. It's a good idea to sow as many as you can to give the best chance of success. When the seed germinates each seed has between two and four embryos with each embryonic 'foot' entering the branch and potentially forming a clump but it is a long drawn out process and you're unlikely to see berries for a few years.

As well as the mistletoe it can be fun to sow the holly berries from the rest of your decorations. Holly is a strange plant as each tree or bush is male or female and only the female produces berries. Gardeners who named some of the choice garden species were one jump ahead of this highly topical gender identification business since Ilex (Holly) Golden King is female and Ilex Silver Queen is male. If you want berries clearly you need Golden King. Each holly berry has about four seeds so what do we do? It's quite simple, mix up about three handfuls of sand to one of compost in a fairly large pot and sow the seeds about an inch deep. Leave the pot in a shady place right around until next spring, keep watered and leave a bit of wire mesh over the pot to keep the mice away. Some fifteen months later after they've been exposed to a warm summer and a cold winter the first holly seedlings should start to appear and can be potted on. It's best to pot them into at least a five-inch pot to grow on as they don't like their roots disturbed.

That's all for this month.

Christian Message

In November 1938 about 30,000 German Jewish men were taken to concentration camps where they were tortured, starved and put to death.

Aware of what was happening a group of English Jews asked the British Government for permission to set up a transit camp at a disused site in Sandwich to house 4,000 of these men. Approval was given and the group which raised funds for the operation arranged for the camp to be made ready for occupation.

Sandwich may not have seemed the ideal refuge for foreigners. At the time there was a branch of the British Union of Fascists in the town and Oswald Mosley was a regular visitor.

How would the residents of Sandwich respond to this invasion which actually doubled the size of the town? The answer is that there was a warm reception. Local people were friendly and welcomed the refugees to their homes. Once settled in, the men worked on the buildings and then occupied themselves putting on concerts and theatricals which were attended by many Sandwich residents. Local events were patronised by the refugees who took part in Ramsgate carnival. The Archbishop of Canterbury visited the camp.

Jesus parable of the Good Samaritan is well known (Luke 10: 25-27) and over the years the phrase 'a good Samaritan' has become part of our language. The first person to hear Jesus' story was an expert in the Jewish law. One day he had a question for Jesus: **What must I do to inherit eternal life?** Jesus responded with a question of his own, **What does the law say?** The man replied, Love the Lord your God with all your heart and your neighbour as yourself. 10 marks out of 10. End of discussion? Oh no! This man wanted more. **But who is my neighbour?** To answer the man's question Jesus told a story about an injured man in the road who was ignored by two respectable religious men. Eventually a foreigner, a Samaritan, came along, tended his wounds, took him to a safe place and arranged for his care. Now it was Jesus turn to ask a question. **Which of the three passers-by was neighbour to the injured man?** We all know the answer!

England is still described as a Christian country. All who describe themselves as Christians are commanded to behave in the way taught by Jesus in his parable. Believers in Christ are commanded to love God and their neighbour. Indeed, there are many Christians in our country behaving in such a way.

But, and there's always a BUT, all around us are remarks about our neighbours who are a different colour, speak a different language, have different customs from us or have come to our country, often by dangerous means, because they had been ill-treated in their own as the Jews who came to Sandwich had been. They are DIFFERENT FROM US. But are they really so different? Think again.

Turn now to the story of creation in the first chapter of the Bible. In verse 26 God said, "Let us make men in our own image" and the summing up in verse 27: **So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.** Not different. The same.

So we look back and thank God for the example of those who helped fellow human beings to safety and for the people of Sandwich who welcomed them.

A record 129 numbers were included in the draw giving a prize fund of £129



Patient Participation Group (PPG)

Many organisations have had to change the way they communicate to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and the Len Valley Practice is no exception. Due to the reduction of face-to-face interaction, telephone calls and text messages are proving to be a vital method of communication between the patient and the practice. To provide continuity of care, practice staff (including Doctors, Nurses, Pharmacists, Reception staff etc.) will contact patients by telephone and text to manage their health e.g. telephone appointments, medication reviews, or to discuss test results etc. The full list of current practice staff can be found at <https://www.lenvalleypractice.co.uk>.

The (PPG) are aware of the ever-increasing number of fraudulent calls being made by criminals trying to illicit personal details from people for illegal gains. Therefore, the PPG want to reassure patients that practice staff will NEVER ask for a person's bank details, pin number or password. Practice staff may ask for the patient's date of birth to verify the patient's identity and maintain confidentiality but practice staff will also have full access to the patient's medical notes and can provide information to verify their identity too.

If patients are in doubt of the authenticity of any call they receive they should hang up, telephone someone they know (to check that the telephone line has become free again) before contacting the practice direct to confirm whether anyone has tried to contact them.

Recipe for Liver Stroganoff

*Another luxury recipe from **Peter Brown**. If you haven't tried liver before this would be a very tasty way to start.*

Serves 4 cost under £10.00.

Preparation & cooking time 30mins

Ingredients

1lb Lambs Liver cut into thin strips
4 tbs plain flour
4 tbs cooking oil
8ozs button mushrooms halved
8ozs button onions or shallots
½pt milk & veg stock combined
¼pt fresh soured cream
2 tbs brandy
Fresh Parsley
Cayenne pepper
1lb dried tagliatelle
1oz butter
1 clove garlic crushed

Method

Toss the strips of liver in the flour, heat the oil in a large frying pan and after cooking the liver for a few minutes in batches and remove it from the pan. Add the onions to the pan and cook under medium heat for 5 mins, return the liver to the pan and add the mushrooms, cook for a further 2 mins. Stir in the rest of the flour and gradually add the milk & stock stirring all the time bring it to the boil, turn the heat down & simmer the mixture for 10 to 15 mins to reduce it. Stir in the soured cream, brandy, a pinch of cayenne pepper and 2 tbs chopped parsley, cook for a further 2 mins, add seasoning if required.

Bring a saucepan of water to the boil and add the tagliatelle, cook for 10 mins, drain and return to the saucepan with the melted butter and garlic, cook for a further 2mins.

Serve the Stroganoff with the pasta & garnish with chopped parsley.


