

Living with Dementia

At the Parish Meeting on 24 April Michael Smithson of the Ala eimer's Society gave a highly informative presentation about 'Dementia'. Those present were shocked to learn that dementia is now the biggest cause of death in the UK. Michael provided a summary of the seriv ces are ilable to people liv ng with dementia and their carers. These include Home support seriv ces, dementia cafes, peer support groups and a y unger carer's group. Dementia can strike at any age and he reported that the y ungest person liv ng with dementia locally at present is in their 40s. He went on to adv se that it is good for both mind and body to continue in activ ties. There are some dementia specific activities available at Mote Park Leisure Centre and he also mentioned the Mytime Active Group at Cobtree Manor Park, who offer free dementia friendly golf programmes. There are more activ ties in the summer months.

Michael discussed 'Time for Dementia', which raises awareness among healthcare professionals by holding talks by people liv ng with dementia themselves to students in Universities in the region and to GPs and in Hospitals. He referred to Dementia Friends who support the idea of local buses for community groups, and provide information and training to encourage emplovers and others to be more dementia friendly enabling those living with dementia to continue to be active members of the community.

Whilst there are many different types of dementia the most prevalent are Alzheimer's Disease and Vascular Dementia. The latter is stroke and TIA (mini-stroke) related and affects the brain.

The syn ptoms of dementia include memory loss (mainly short-term), a wish to go home where this is an earlier home rather than the current one, a lack of concentration and inability to organise or prioritise. Sometimes ability to use language and spatial skills are affected. There can be a lack of awareness of place, date, time, season and weather relear nt to today.

Dementia affects everyone differently. A person may look the same, but their personality may change. Dementia also affects the physical health of the person. Many people try to conceal their syn ptoms.

He said that whilst at present there is no cure, big improve ments are anticipated over the next ten years. He also said that there are some medications which slow down the progress of specific types of dementia. They provide a better quality of life but may have some side effects.

Michael adv sed people liv ng with dementia to carry personal information discreetly on them, for example, on a wristband, to enable a contact point/person to be traced if someone is lost or needs help. He also mentioned that mobile phones with GPS fitted are \mathbf{e} ry good for tracking and helping people liv ng with dementia.

He encouraged us to become dementia friendly communities, empowering people with dementia and recognising their contribution. This reinforces the idea of 'liv ng with dementia' in place of 'suffering from dementia'.

Top Tips

55

Dialling '55' during a 999 call will not enable the emergency services to track ${\it y}$ ur location.

Accidental 999 calls happen all the time, but operators may be unable to tell if a silent call is a real call for help. The emergency seriv ces receive millions of calls every v_{ij} ar, most of which result in a request being made for emergency seriv ces such as police, fire or ambulance to attend. But, around 30 million calls a year do not follow the usual pattern, with no one speaking on the call.

However, The Home Office has had (or at least it did as of July this year) a system in place called Silent Solutions, which helps callers, such as domestic abuse *v* ctims, who cannot speak to an operator:

- If you have been able to signal that your call is an emergency, by coughing after dialling 999, then y u will be put through to the police.
- If you are in danger, you could be asked to dial a number, for example, "55" or to give any other indication whilst on the line, otherwise the call could be terminated.
- If you make a 999 call but you are not able to speak, if, for example, someone is in your house, then the 999 control room will give you instructions in order to indicate to them that you are in need of help and that the call has not been made in error.
- Generally any sort of sound that the BT operator is not sure about will result in passing the call to the Police, even if the caller hangs up for whatever r reason before they are connected.

ATM PIN Number Reversal hoax email

We have been alerted to a hoax email that has been circulating purporting to originate from Crimestoppers. It claims that if y u enter y ur pin number in reverse into a cash point the police will be sent to y ur location. This information is not true. This email did not originate with Crimestoppers. Its content is false.

If **y** u receive this email or a similar one, please ignore it. The adiv ce contained in the email is false, so there is no reason to forward the email onto any ne else.

Christian Message

Our Bishop, the Rt Rev Treo r Willmott retired in May. During the 9 y ars of his ministry in Canterbury he has become fairly well known in the Len Valley and has confirmed many of our church members.

In his farewell Easter letter to the Diocese Bishop Trev r wrote that the story of Easter is not a fairy story but a story of hope. It is the hope from which all others take their meaning. In his words, 'it is not a wishy washy phenomenon, but the concrete assurance of a *v* ctory already won.' 'Vain optimism,' he went on, 'will not solve the divisions of our age nor will the temptation to give in to despair'. Quoting the epistle to the Hebrews, the Bishop wrote 'Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conv ction of things not seen.'

He maintained that the Church is called to be a beacon of hope in our parishes and communities. Hope is hard and it is alway costly to those who seek the way of reconciliation, justice and truth. 'Faith is the gift of God to his people', continued the Bishop, 'and the church is called to live and embody the kind of hope made real by faith – life changing concrete hope. Though we, the Diocese may be small in number and financially challenged, we must not give in to despair. We are people of hope.'

Bishop Treo r commented on the stories he has heard of those engaged in churchrun food banks, night shelters and debt adiv ce centres. 'I hear', he wrote, 'of people coming to faith through simple and honest human contact and compassion.'

As we in the Len Valley look back with gratitude to the ministry of Bishop Trev r and Mrs Willmott let's pray for his retirement and heed his call to be a beacon of hope.


