

St John the Baptist Parish Church

The last issue of the magazine showed a lovely picture of the Parish Church in winter on the front cover. Those of you who have driven past the church recently or walked through the churchyard will have seen evidence of builders working at the back of the church since July last year – what have they been doing?

Well, now the work is finished we can reveal that they have been constructing a new disabled toilet facility and kitchen area which is accessible from inside the church. This is to replace the rather uneven path to the north side of the tower which led to a very old (and cold) outside toilet!

The works were estimated to take 4-5 months hopefully to be completed before Christmas. However, any of you who have been involved in any building works know there are always snags. The work was held up for a month following the disturbance of human bones which required re-burial. The weather was also not kind to the builders but the work was eventually finished by the last week in January with the new facilities being dedicated in a regular Sunday service at the beginning of February taken by the Archdeacon of Maidstone.

The modern facility was designed by David Gullick of Clague Architects and duly passed by the Canterbury Diocese. The builders, Gransdens of Sittingbourne, have been painstaking in their attention to detail during the undertaking of the work to a 14th Century building. This has meant a huge cost which has been funded by Section 106 Monies plus very generous donations from the Friends of St John's, the Association of Kent Churches, a private Charitable Trust and the estate of Roger Irwin and his family.

We are looking forward to holding more functions in the church now that these new facilities are up and running. They include a larger open plan area as well as the kitchen. These will be available to the local community as well as church organisations. Our next Family Friendly Morning Worship service will be held on Sunday March 1 at 9.30am. Details of all our services are in the magazine and we would be pleased to welcome anyone who would like to attend.

Church Extension

It may have been a long time coming but what a difference the provision of an inside W.C. and improved kitchen facilities have made to our lovely church, not to mention the relaying of the surrounding floor area which is so much safer.

I am sure that all people involved with catering in the church must be very grateful to the builders, plumbers, electricians etc. who have done the work and also to the local unsung heroes the churchwardens – Richard Daking and Paul Hicks - whose own lives have been more or less put on hold while they oversaw the project. Together with Ken Leach they also did much of the practical finishing work which produced such a splendid result.

Craft & Chat and Crafternoon

At the last few meetings of Craft and Chat, members have enjoyed making their crazy quilted pincushions and some have tried silk ribbon embroidery for the first time. Box of treats cards have also been created with Valentine's and other themes and at the March meeting of Craft and Chat, on Saturday 7 March between 1-4pm at Harrietsham Village Hall, the project will be a redwork embroidered Easter themed piece. When the embroidery is finished, the piece will be able to be used in a project such as a small cushion. Redwork looks good with rustic type fabrics like burlap or hessian but personally, I prefer it with Osnaburg as this fabric has quite a rustic look but is much softer than the other rustic fabrics and I can imagine an Osnaburg cushion with the redwork embroidery at the centre. Red gingham would also give an authentic look with redwork embroidery. As long as people who want to do this let me know in plenty of time, I will have the design printed on fabric ready for them to start embroidering and we will be using the split stitch (or Kensington stitch as it was once known) as an outline stitch. An embroidery hoop, red stranded cotton or coton a broder 25 will be all that is needed along with a crewel needle and scissors.

Then, at Crafternoon, on Thursday 19 March between 2-4pm at Harrietsham Village Hall, Heather will be leading with her Easter egg box project. These would make great little Easter gifts for children or grandchildren and Heather will be making up kits (which members will have pre-ordered) so that people can make more than one if they wish. Everything will be provided for £1 a box except for the eggs to go inside and a small paintbrush for applying glue and scissors.

Race Night Fundraiser for Macmillan Cancer Support

On Friday 13 March, I am holding a Race Night fundraiser to support my marathon attempt this year. I have a goal of raising £2500 for MacMillan Cancer Support, a charity which I have been involved with for a number of years.

Cancer is a disease that 1 in 2 of us will get during our lives. In the UK 990 people are diagnosed with cancer every day. That's one person every 2 minutes. In 2013 that was my sister. My sister was 24 weeks pregnant when she noticed a lump. After going to the doctors she had the lump removed. This turned out to be a secondary tumour. She had a metastatic melanoma. In order to commence her treatment my nephew had to be born at 28 weeks via a C-section. During this time the doctors gave her 6 months to live. That was 6 years ago and she is still with us, still fighting against this horrendous disease. She is my hero as she has faced all of her treatment, hospital stays and ongoing illnesses with courage and a smile on her face.

Along the way she has had the support of many different organisations but Macmillan have supported and continue to support her and her family through the illness. The work they do enables families like my sister's to get though their treatment with the support they need. From counselling to providing money when people are unable to work due to their illness.

I have done some challenges in the past but nothing like this. This is by far the biggest, most daunting thing I have ever done. Yet, this is nothing compared to the suffering that my sister and other cancer sufferers across the UK go through just to make it through the day. I would love the residents of Harrietsham to support me in the event by donating or attending the event. 



Maidstone Borough Council News

On January 24 along with 300 residents from Harrietsham, Lenham, Platts Heath, Sandway, Boughton Malherbe, Grafty Green, Charing, Egerton, our local MP and local Councillors, we attended a public meeting in Lenham Community Centre. Questions were directed at the Maidstone Borough Council Leadership Team, on the proposal to build a garden community at Lenham Heath. The Council have been encouraged to write a collective letter to the Housing Minister, on behalf of residents from the borough, challenging the government's housing proposals, rethink garden communities, not accept unsustainable housing levels, complete an infrastructure assessment and be transparent and work with local communities. Local impact of current proposals is unthinkable and a petition has been raised to challenge those proposals.

Primary Care Networks (PCN) are formed by groups of GP practices formally working together with a Medical Director to provide additional or extended services for all their registered patients. NHS England has funded the development of the PCNs. In West Kent there are 9 PCNs. Len Valley Practice is part of 'The Ridge' PCN consisting of: Orchard Surgery at Langley, Sutton Valence Group Practice, Bearsted Medical Practice and Headcorn Surgery.

Our story...

My aim is to run both the Landmark half marathon and the London Marathon in 2020! I will be running in memory of our daughter Rebecca who was stillborn at term following a 'normal' low risk pregnancy.

Rebecca was our second child. Feeling her move normally two hours before arriving at hospital in labour, we were excited to be adding to our family. No heartbeat was detected once at the hospital.

Leaving the hospital without our little girl was the hardest thing we have ever had to do and the weeks that followed are a blur. No parent ever thinks that they will have to register their child's death rather than their birth, nor organise their funeral but in the UK this is the fate 15 parents face every day.

Abigail's Footsteps are leading the way in this area. From the provision of bereavement training for midwives and care staff, to the purchase of cold cots, to the production of awareness film through the eyes of a mother whose child is to be stillborn, to the construction of dedicated bereavement rooms away from labour wards, to the production of detailed information booklets with advice and guidance from parents who have already suffered the loss of a child; the charity wants to do all it can to try and ease the pain endured by parents and their families affected by stillbirth.

A year and a day after losing Rebecca our rainbow baby boy Luca was born, healthy and happy.





Christian Message

I packed my bag and in it I put......

With milestone birthdays for us both and me retiring from brass teaching after 20+ years at Sutton Valence schools, my husband and I knew 2019 was set to be a time of change and a year of travel. In February Neill had a wonderful trip to New Zealand spending time with his daughter and, in April, I went on a much talked of, eagerly anticipated Pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Then, fulfilling a life-time ambition, I arranged to do some voluntary teaching in The Gambia at Yalding School in Farato, a project founded and funded by donations raised by Karen Mackenzie, a former colleague at Kent Music School. So, after Last Post renditions, leaving a dull, grey November behind me, I accompanied Karen, joining her husband Tony, on one of their regular stays on site to put my music experience and crafting experience to good use.

After the pilgrimage I was telling people that I had left my heart in the Holy Land and now I add that I left my head in The Gambia. Experiences can be life-threatening or life-enhancing but I can only say that these two visits were mind-changing: both have significantly affected how I think, evaluate and appraise matters not only of religious practices, but ethics, ecology, politics, customs, human rights, domestic and economic standards and moral responsibility...and more!

I'd been shocked by the Wall of Partition in Bethlehem and the contrast between the Israeli and Palestinian areas we visited and, similarly nothing could have prepared me for the extreme poverty, vast amounts of debris and general lack of amenities in and round Farato. Compounds where many live are built mainly of corrugated, rusted panels and, in cramped conditions, have little more than very basic sanitary and culinary facilities. In some communities FGM is still practised and 'period poverty' is experienced by young girls.

Like me, you may be familiar with the memory game which begins, 'I packed my bag and in it I put...' but in this case (no pun intended) I was asked to pack an actual alphabet in the form of boxed word games as aids to teaching reading skills phonetically; also pens, pencils, paintbrushes and...footballs — thankfully deflated ones! Once re-inflated these were allocated one per class and presented to beaming pupils. Prior to my visit, there had been only one football for the whole school.

I quickly found myself immersed in the sounds, sights and routines of animated children – 40 per class and a team of staff, closely observed and much stimulated by Karen's hands-on educational expertise – all working in extreme heat (38° mostly) with very limited resources. The phonics boxes were put to immediate use and I spent part of each morning with Nursery 4 children helping them with puzzles and pronunciation.

In addition to this, I was able to devise and complete 3 craft projects with different age-groups. They created colourful fan-winged birds, rocking chickens and butterflies with symmetrical paint patterned wings which were instantly displayed in the otherwise rather bare classrooms.

I managed to practise my trumpet most days and, after writing out the words and notation for The Gambian National Anthem, visited each classroom to have a singing session prior to my final Friday whole school assembly when they all sang with gusto and trumpet accompaniment! "Let justice guide our nation towards the common good and join our diverse peoples to prove man's brotherhood."

It's said that life is a journey not a destination and that God meets you where you are. I can say that, despite wrong turns and bumpy roads at times, my travels have brought me to Ulcombe, and ten years ago gave me the opportunity to work as a Church Music Leader in the Len Valley Benefice where I have been privileged to meet many inspirational clergy people and forged valuable friendships. Across the 4 churches, when hearing of my planned trip, you gave generously – not just portable educational items but over £600 in donations to School Gambia. Karen wishes to invest this in publishing her new Gambian First Readers. I want to say a huge thank you for that and, also, for your prayer support and enthusiastic interest in what was for me a truly extraordinary experience.

Top Tips by Harrietsham Gardening Society

A gardener works to the rhythms of nature, in an annual cycle. The gardener's activity begins in March, when most plants start to grow after their winter dormancy. This month has the most pronounced variations of weather from day to day so the gardener must take advantage of dry spells to get on with the garden and the cultivation of plants and seeds.

1st week

Sow sweet peas outside, sow annuals for the greenhouse and for the garden, repot foliage plants, sow cauliflower and broccoli in a frame, broad beans in trays, plant rhubarb and strawberries and cucumbers for an early crop.

2nd week

Sow herbaceous perennials and alpines, seeds of geraniums and fuchsia, peas, pot early tomatoes sown in January and sow seeds for more tomatoes to plant out in June.

3rd week

Plant Autumn sown sweet peas, sow hardy annuals outside, plant gladioli, start cannas and dahlias, start begonias, sow carrots and leeks outdoors.

4th week

Prune roses, sow chard, lettuce, broad beans, peas, french beans in succession, plant melons. The expert may feel this is too arbitrary a scheme, contending that most garden tasks can be done over a longer period than indicated, but this is intended for the beginner with desire for guidance.
