

As some of you will already know I am the Parish Warden for Harrietsham. I had previously worked in a similar role for Kent County Council and have been in this area since 2010.

There has been an increase in various types of scams over recent years. These have involved the use of new technologies including Artificial Intelligence and Social Media. Unfortunately, that does not mean that more traditional scam methods do not happen. To help you protect yourself from becoming a victim of fraud use ABC.

NEVER ASSUME NEVER BELIEVE ALWAYS CONFIRM

If you are called by someone saying they are from your bank end the call before giving any personal information. Ring them back using a different phone, if possible, on a trusted number, to confirm that the call is genuine.

If you think you may have been scammed, contact your bank without delay and then report it to ActionFraud. Scammers rely on you being ashamed about being tricked so help your family and friends by telling them what happened to you.

Local development - Heathlands

We have attended a couple of stakeholder meetings regarding the proposed Heathlands development. Whilst the power of the group is limited, we want to ensure that every detail is scrutinised and the developer is held to account for the full contribution of infrastructure delivery – road, rail, school, health etc. We are reminded that Heathlands was the least viable proposal originally put forward at MBC and that the financial viability was, and presumably still is, marginal.

Devolution and Local Government

The devolution programme has been announced by Angela Rayner, deputy Prime Minister.

KCC with Medway Council has not been successful in its application and not been selected to be part of the devolution priority programme

Thus, at the time of writing KCC elections will take place in May 2025 as originally scheduled.



Christian Message Strengthen the rubbery knees!

Did you ever have one of those toys which were a wooden animal on top of a base with a push plunger in it? When you push the plunger, the strings would go slack and the animal would wiggle around and collapse! They're so simple but so fun! It's less fun on the occasions when our own lives feel like that! We all face times when our own knees are suddenly feeling a lot less rigid!

There is a passage in the Bible, in Isaiah 35:3-4, which gives an amazing encouragement to those who may feel in that situation. In a paraphrase of the Bible called 'The Message', we read the following:

Energize the limp hands, strengthen the rubbery knees. Tell fearful souls, "Courage! Take heart! God is here, right here, on his way to put things right And redress all wrongs. He's on his way! He'll save you!"

Verses like this are so impactful because they are outworked with two different emphases. In this passage is both an uplifting promise for the way God desires to care for us and also a picture of who He wants us to be for others.

The verses speak so intimately of a God who is not distant or aloof. He is not a hard taskmaster wagging his finger at our failings. Instead, He is "here, right here, on his way to put things right and redress all wrongs". How awesome it is to know that the divine creator of the universe desires to be involved in the challenges of our day to day lives! We can put our hope in Him. He is a God of justice and restoration!

As well as being on the receiving end, we get to be the one who brings this good news and aids in the strengthening of others! Jesus demonstrated the 'strengthening of rubbery knees' in extraordinary ways and we follow his example. When we consider those with whom we share our life; our family, our close friends, our colleagues, I'm sure that we can all think of those whose hands are feeling weak at this time.
