



VE 80 - the fight goes on

This month we will commemorate the stoic resilience and sacrifice of the Second World War generation as we remember the end of the War in Europe, and then later in August, the end of hostilities in East Asia.

If my memory of history and the books I have read is right, we went to war in 1939 for two reasons: to bring about the unconditional surrender of Germany and to defeat Nazism. While the first was realised in May 1945, unfortunately the struggle against dictatorship and intolerance goes on. And if ever a war could be justified, it was this one.

Currently, we again have war in Europe and in many countries around the world prejudice and discrimination are on the increase. Antisemitism is on the rise along with religious intolerance against those of faith. Racist attacks seem daily, as are those against people who express their own sexual and gender identity and disabled people have again become an easy target.

As we rightly honour those of our parents or grandparents who served the cause of freedom and made the ultimate sacrifice and those who lived through the Second World War and as we commemorate and celebrate all they achieved, perhaps it now falls on us to take up the fight and to finish what they started.

But how do we do this? Maybe one of the answers is not in big confrontations like going to war but is in small, daily challenges to those we met who hold and express intolerant ideas. As the philosopher Edmund Burke once said. "The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men (people) to do nothing".



If you, or someone you know, would need extra support in the event of the electricity, water or gas supply being interrupted you can apply to be included on the <u>Priority Services Register</u>.

UK Power Networks, Southeast Water and Southern Gas Networks can all register customers so they can be advised of planned interruptions or receive assistance, if required, in an emergency.

You, or your loved ones, could be eligible to join the Priority Services Register if you're:

- over 60
- have children under five or are pregnant
- have long-term physical or mental health conditions
- have a disability
- have additional language or communication needs

You may only need to register with one of the organisations as they should ask for permission to advise each other of your registration. You can register online via their websites, but if that is not possible, a relative or friend can register for you. I have included contact numbers below if you would prefer to ring.

Update from your local MP Helen Whately

A lot of people think catapults are just kids' toys. Yet I am receiving more and more emails from people sharing stories about how they are being used to cause devastating harm.

That's why I am campaigning for them to be classed as 'offensive weapons' so the Police have the powers they need to take action.

I have been told how catapults have been used to knock out people's teeth, seriously maim or kill pets and wildlife, as well damage property including shattering car windscreens and breaking house and shed windows. Reports about the damage catapults cause is growing more serious and more widespread.



I have been working hard to change the law. Last year, I led an initiative with other Kent MPs pressing the Home Office to do more to tighten up on catapults.

In January I met the Policing Minister to push for them to be classed as offensive weapons and grant the police the right to confiscate them.

I am now looking at whether I can get the forthcoming Crime Bill amended to achieve this. In the coming weeks I will be asking more questions in Parliament and following up with Ministers to keep up the pressure.

Sometimes anglers use a special kind of catapult to spread bait – but there's no reason for anglers to be affected by a crackdown on catapults used as weapons.

There is a Parliamentary petition calling for companies to be banned from selling dangerous catapults and ammunition in the UK which you can sign by typing in this link: https://petition.parliament.uk/petitions/701064 or searching for 'Parliamentary catapult petition'.

The petition was set up by Danni Rogers, a volunteer at the Shepperton Swan Sanctuary, after numerous attacks on swans. If the petition reaches 100,000 signatures by 27 May it will force a debate in Parliament – which will also help to raise awareness of the problem.

I will not rest until something is done, but I need your help. To build a strong case I want to gather as much evidence as possible. So, if you or someone you know has had a bad experience with catapults, please share it with me.

Harrietsham Station

Appeal on behalf of the community in Harrietsham – this is the usual approach when asking for money, but in this case Harrietsham is asking for your appreciation of an asset that can easily be lost and never regained.

Dr Beeching, the well- known chemical engineer, was brought in to rationalise the Railways in the 60's. This infamous Maidstone resident used much of his engineering skills in disabling the Railways on a slash and burn approach, instead of targeting his wrath towards efficiency and looking at the value of some (but not all) routes etc.

Modern days have seen the same approach with South East Trains (SET) and many other train companies attempting to force through closures of Booking Offices throughout the country. This was only curtailed and mostly reversed, by a high-profile Consultation which was challenged by the UK population under the banner of retention community benefits.

Harrietsham now has a Booking Office Clerk, Rob who is keen to see the station used to its full potential. The Booking Office and the heated waiting room are available Monday to Friday, 06:10 - 10:25. The problem that is likely to occur is that SET will look at the usage of this facility and the adage of 'use or lose' will be raised. We have all been encouraged recently to use on line facilities, but losing the clerk's position will significantly degrade this vital asset, especially as we now have a haphazard bus timetable (Service 510 – the new name for the old 10X bus) that has already lost its Sunday service! Harrietsham was until fairly recently, being offered up as a Transport Hub for our expanding village and surrounding communities – this would seem to have dropped off SET's objectives and the loss of a staffed station would further hit that aspiration.

If not staffed, the Waiting Room will be closed permanently, no station support for disabled passengers will be available, travel information will be curtailed (the help point system is atrocious and the screens are often out of order) and passengers will not have access to a person that can both advise and sell you tickets (and for cash – as the ticketing machine on the station is card only).

We have unfortunately been used to the station being unmanned – it is now time to acclimatise us all back to having and using the service. Please use the facility, avoid paying for tickets on the train by getting them at the Booking Office, keep warm in the Waiting Room and just welcome Rob to his new role.

Christian Message

What is the "church"? We have a wonderful medieval building on the Square in Lenham, dedicated to St Mary, which we call our "church". But in the years just following the death and resurrection of Jesus there were no buildings specifically for Christian worship and the "church" was the family of Christian worshippers. It is important to remember that the church is about people more than it is about buildinas.

In the third century after Jesus. Christians began to set aside buildings specifically for worship and gradually they became known as "churches". Now there are many ancient buildings that are very special to us, they are places where people have prayed and worshipped over the centuries and it is possible to feel the atmosphere inside and sense the presence of God. They are amazing places for Christians to join together and develop their relationship with God. But we can do that in other places too, for example at the war memorial across the A20, and we still meet in house groups, very similar to those in the first century.

People meet together in St Mary's every day of the week, not always to sing hymns and to worship formally. The building is used for many purposes, for bellringing and choir singing, for coffee and chat, for Wednesday Feast, for sewing circle, for the food bank.

When Archbishop William Temple was reported as saying, "The church is the only society on earth that exists for the benefit of non-members." he was talking about the church as the family of believers. It is this thought that inspires the Christian family to use the church building for the good of all the community.

At St Mary's we are currently raising money for the Hub project, which will open up the church building for much more flexible use for the benefit of the Lenham community. Jesus instructed us to love our neighbours and it is the working out of this that drives us to use the church building as widely as possible, not just for Christian worship.

The need for good village venues is increasing as Lenham doubles and redoubles in population. St Mary's has a long and interesting history at the very centre of the community. We have an amazing opportunity to develop the church building as a place where the church family can meet, where the community can gather for Christenings, Weddings and Funerals, and where we can have the space for many activities for the wellbeing of all who live in our village.
