Your 'Friends' Need YOU!!!

Hi Everybody!

We do indeed! We need more active members on our Management Committee of The Friends of St John the Baptist Church, Harrietsham. I am writing this plea as I gave my notice at the last AGM in March, that I would be standing down as Chair with effect from the next AGM (March 2025). At the moment we are a small group of 7, two of the group are Treasurer and Secretary - and myself plus 4 committee members. I have been Chair for the past 5 years and a committee member for a lot longer. I am fully committed and want the committee to carry on the good work that the Friends do.

Without more active members willing to join our Management Committee, we probably will be unable to continue our regular activities in the future and may have to cease raising money for the church, separately from the Diocese. Our efforts from 2017 to 2020 raised more than £79,000 to help with funding for the new internal toilet and kitchen, a new organ, repairs to the weathervane, provision of disabled access, internal decoration and the installation of glass entrance doors.

For your information, the Friends is a secular organisation concerned with raising money to help maintain and improve the Grade 1 Listed church for the benefit of ALL the people of Harrietsham, now and in the future. Whilst it is true that the Friends work with the church authorities, we are independent of them being a registered charity formed in 2001 and concerned with the building itself.

My hope is that I will be able to hand over to someone at the AGM next year. So please have a think and come and have a chat if you think this is something you could do, it really is so rewarding! Thank you.

Knit, Crochet and Craft

Occasionally, at Knit, Crochet and Craft, we do other craft projects and a macrame angel that can be added to a Christmas tree is planned soon.

Do come and join us if you enjoy knitting, crochet or other crafts or if you would like to learn to knit or crochet. We meet on the first Monday of the month between 7-9pm and the third Monday of the month between 2-4pm both meetings in Harrietsham Village Hall. Everyone is invited to bring along whatever craft they would like to work on. Cakes, coffee and tea plus fruit juice for the children if wanted is always served. Harrietsham History Society

We Will Remember Them

11 November 1918, Harrietsham joined the nation in celebrating the end of World War I. News of the armistice spread quickly, and villagers gathered at St John the Baptist Church to ring the bells—a long-silenced symbol of hope and relief. While joy filled the village, there was also grief, as many families had lost loved ones in the conflict.

Many young men from Harrietsham joined the East Kent Regiment, known as "The Buffs." They were involved in significant battles throughout the war, including Mons, Ypres, the Somme, and Passchendaele. The Battle of Mons in 1914 was their first major action, marking the beginning of a long struggle against German forces. The retreat from Mons, and later engagements at Ypres, were characterised by fierce fighting and heavy losses.

The Battle of the Somme in 1916 was especially brutal for The Buffs. They faced relentless artillery bombardment and machine-gun fire as they advanced across no man's land. The Battle of Passchendaele in 1917 further tested the resilience of The Buffs, with its appalling conditions and muddy trenches becoming a symbol of the horror of trench warfare.

Following the armistice, Harrietsham held a thanksgiving service in St John the Baptist Church. The Women's Institute organised a gathering at the village hall, where residents shared what little they had to celebrate the peace. Although rationing was still in place, the spirit of unity was strong as villagers helped each other move towards a brighter future.

The fallen are forever remembered and the War Memorial in the remembrance garden at St John the Baptist Church stands as a lasting tribute to their sacrifice. The history society supported by the local community completed the War Memorial Project in 2018 and on Remembrance Sunday, 14 November 2018 Revd. Millie Hart blessed the Roll of Honour. The Roll of Honour stands as a testament to the lives lost, reminding us of the personal stories behind each name.

We are proud of our growing archive, which documents the lives of those from Harrietsham who fought and lived through the Great War. We will continue to research and add names to the village memorial, ensuring that every sacrifice is remembered. We were really pleased to be able to take part in the Shaun the sheep trail in the town. We went searching a number of times with our grandchildren, the sculptures were amazing, each with an individual theme and beautifully decorated by many artists. The subsequent auction that took place raised over £265k for the Heart of Kent Hospice.

Accessible Well-being - Knowing yourself

On my road to well-being, I discovered the importance of knowing myself. This was one of the starting points in my journey. Surprisingly, It isn't an easy task. Even though it may seem like an irrelevant endeavour, "Of course, I know myself! This is me, isn't it?", however knowing yourself is one of the hardest things we can achieve.

Man... knows only when he is satisfied and when he suffers, and only his sufferings and his satisfactions instruct him concerning himself, teach him what to seek and what to avoid. For the rest, man is a confused creature; he knows not whence he comes or whither he goes, he knows little of the world, and above all, he knows little of himself.

Why is it difficult? Because, from birth to our last breath, we are living under constant influence, and it is hard to see who we are under all the pressure and expectations that are applied to us. But it is vitally important to understand yourself. Why? Because we cannot love anything or anyone whom we don't know properly, even when that "anyone" is ourselves.

This was about "why?" to know yourself. Now let's talk about "how?"

Think about your life. Write down distinct periods, like Early childhood, Primary school, the Beginning of independence... etc. You can separate those main periods into smaller subdivisions if you want. Then recall as many significant moments from those periods as you can and write them down. It could be a single event or something that continued over longer periods (Best present ever or relationship with grandparents, or bullying). How to understand if the event was significant? If, after many years you still remember it well, it was significant.

Now, describe the event as well as you could. What exactly happened, who was involved, how did you feel about it then, and how do you feel about it now. When writing it down try to write non-stop. Do not stop to think, write as you think. This is a method known as "free-writing" and it produces an effect similar to brain-storm. It can also be helpful if you will set a time for this exercise, let's say three to five minutes, during which you'll be writing.

Next, analyse each event. Write down how the experience affected your life, how it contributed to the building of your character, who you are today and how it influenced your view of yourself, other people and the world. (Do it using free-writing).

It is, obviously, a very extensive work. It can take several months to analyse your life this way, but the result will be significant. You will learn a lot about yourself, will understand how your character was formed and will learn to see your positive and negative traits, which will help you in your life.

Some Gave All, All Gave Some

When we gather at our village War Memorial this Remembrance Sunday, we will bow our heads for two minutes in respect and remember, as the 49 names of our local fallen from World War One and World War Two are read out. And rightly so. For they gave all.

But if we look down at the very bricks beneath our feet, we will see many more names. All of them have a connection to Harrietsham in that they were either born here, grew up here, lived here or married someone from the village. And they all served in one or both World Wars.

They were lucky enough to be the ones who came home, but many of them were wounded and damaged, in body, mind or spirit. All of them will have witnessed things they could never have imagined before their military service and many of them will have lost friends or family in the Wars.

We might particularly remember four young friends, two of them brothers who all joined up on the same day in the First World War and went off to fight. The two brothers were both sent to the same unit and one, Fredrick, had to bury his brother George when he was killed in action. During the War the two other friends also died, so Fredrick came home after the War, alone, to a Harrietsham which for him would have been full of memories of his mates and the things they had done together.

Other names on the bricks beneath our feet we know very little about in terms of their lives and experiences, and we can only guess what they might have gone through, but it is only right that while we remember our War dead we also respect and give thanks for those who gave some, whatever that some might have been.

Harrietsham Community Speedwatch

As we all know, the average speed cameras have gone.

Well, they were only supposed to be with us for a six-month trial period - but they definitely worked! Over 64 days earlier this year they caught over 800 vehicles speeding through the village - not including the days when the new 5G mast was being erected or the M20 was closed – and each would have been served an enforcement notice by Kent Police.

Shellina Prendergast, our KCC Member for our area, has proposed to KCC Highways that the average speed cameras be alternated between us and Brasted where they were before coming to us.

However, Kent Police are saying that these cameras do not follow the criteria for safety/speed cameras issued by the Kent and Medway Safety Camera Partnership. This simply states that cameras should only be installed where "at least one person has been killed or seriously injured in a speed-related crash in the three years prior to installation". It is over 16 years since we had a death on the Ashford Road!

However, I hope that you agree that Shellina's proposal must be adopted so that we can have our cameras, if not all the time, at least some of the time. I am sure that we are all very concerned that without speed reduction measures the A20 Ashford Road will be subject to serious road traffic accidents, the human cost of which could be incalculable. I believe we would rather not have to have a speed-related death on the road before the return of the cameras.

However, the camera signs stay! But will they restrain the speeders? Many people are saying that the vehicles travelling on the Ashford Road have increased their average speed recently.

Speedwatch has started up again. Unfortunately, the almost continuous wet weather meant that no sessions were possible in September - we are only allowed to Speedwatch when it is dry for technical reasons.

Remember that before the cameras were installed, 3 out of every 20 drivers were in excess of 40mph on the Ashford Road outside the rush hour.
