Harrietsham History Society

On 20 September, Harrietsham Village Hall welcomed speaker Bob Ogley for an insightful talk titled "Doodlebugs and Rockets." The talk captivated the audience with stories of the V-1 flying bombs ("Doodlebugs") and V-2 rockets that terrorized Kent during World War II. Through personal anecdotes and historical photographs, he highlighted the resilience of local communities during these dark times.

The event was a poignant reminder of the courage displayed by those who lived through the Blitz. It was during World War II that Kent, earned the nickname "Bomb Alley" because of its strategic location near the English Channel and its proximity to mainland Europe. This made it a key target for German bombing raids, particularly during two significant periods: the Battle of Britain and the V-1 and V-2 rocket attacks (which the recent talk focused on) later in the war. More that 2,400 flying bombs fell on Kent (more than London) with no less that six V-1 flying bombs falling in the Parish.

- Battle of Britain (1940): Kent's skies were heavily contested during the Battle
 of Britain, as it was one of the first areas over which the German Luftwaffe
 would encounter British defenses. Many air raids targeted the RAF airfields
 and infrastructure in Kent, making it one of the most bombed areas in Britain
 during this period.
- 2. V-1 and V-2 Rocket Attacks (1944-1945): Later in the war, Kent became a primary target for Germany's V-1 flying bombs (also known as "doodlebugs") and V-2 rockets. These were launched from the European continent, and Kent, being one of the closest regions to Nazi-occupied Europe, was often hit first. The V-1s would often crash in Kent if they ran out of fuel before reaching London, while V-2 rockets, which were faster and more destructive, also frequently hit the county.

We sincerely thank all attendees for their support and look forward to seeing you at future events celebrating our local history.

Our minds flashed back to a year before, where, at a service station in the Alps, we had found we needed to convert Euros to Swiss Francs before using these to enter the toilets. A kind local man had seen us in a muddle and given us each a Swiss Franc coin - just in the nick of time!

We gave the young woman a £1 coin, despite her protests, and carried on with our lunch, enjoying the lake view and watching people exercise their dogs by the water's edge with sticks and stones to be fetched from the lake. As we set off to leave, the young woman ran up to our car and offered us a large bar of hazelnut chocolate.

'No, really' we protested. 'It was our pleasure to help and a mere pound wouldn't cover the cost of all your lovely chocolate.' The lady wouldn't be swayed, declaring it was all she had with her to offer and that she couldn't bear to think we were out of pocket. Eventually we caved in - it's not every day someone tries to make you eat such a delicious treat - but I rather wished we hadn't. We had just wanted to do a little something kind.

We drove to Keswick where a teenage girl was leaving the ladies' toilet. After her came another and then another, all giggling. 'There's quite a team of you' I teased as a fourth girl appeared round the corner and they giggled some more. Before I knew it one of them ran back to me:

'Would you like me to jump the barrier and push the button so you can get in for free?' She asked.

'No, it's fine' I replied, 'I'll pay to get in.'


