#### **Collecting Your Medication from the Surgery**

The government paused the coronavirus shielding programme on 31 July 2020. This means, for those of you who have been having your medication delivered by the Covid-19 Support Group volunteers, that this service will cease (unless you have been told otherwise) and you will have to collect your own medication or arrange for someone else to collect it for you. The Glebe surgery in Harrietsham remains closed, although you can still post your repeats through the door as these are collected daily. The closure was due for review at the end of August, unfortunately too late for this issue of Network. At the time of writing Harrietsham residents need to travel to Lenham surgery to collect their medication and due to social distancing and patient and staff safety you will need to queue outside, regardless of weather conditions, when collecting it.

If you are unable to collect your medication from Lenham surgery or cannot queue outside and have no-one who can go for you, please contact the dispensing team at the surgery by calling reception on 01622 858341 for assistance (hopefully, with a delivery to your home).

# Harrietsham and Lenham villages Community Support

Working with and Supported by Harrietsham and Lenham Parish Councils

We wanted to update residents on our current situation from the volunteer's perspective on the pandemic. Some of our volunteers have naturally returned to work. Clearly there is a **new norm** to be found whatever that is. There is uncertainty as to the future path we may walk and with that although village life must function, in order for this to be as safe as we can make it, all must play a part.



#### Masks Whilst Out Shopping Are Now Compulsory

Face coverings must be worn in enclosed public spaces in England - this includes shops, supermarkets, shopping centres, banks, building societies and post offices. It extends to trains, bus stations and airports.

Customers must wear a face covering before entering any shop and keep it on until they leave. Children under 11 and those with certain disabilities are exempt.

#### Maidstone Food Bank

This operates from Knightrider Street and is really important during this period. Many by change of financial situation for the first time now need this service. We urgently need people to make food available for collection on Tuesdays that can be collected by volunteers. Contact 01622 859412. As a reminder we have a **community** fund to financially support our activities. This is long established. It supports, when times are good, events like Lenham Festival. We would be grateful if residents wishing to make any contributions that they be sent by bank transfer to Harrietsham and Lenham Parish Residents Association (HELPERS), sort code 08 92 99 Account 65271434, or alternatively a cheque made out to that organisation and arrange for collection.



#### Len Valley Practice and Saxon Warrior protocols from August 1st will change.

LVP have been told that they need to move as close as possible to a new normal. The pandemic had meant that for practical purposes there needed to be a relaxation of some protocols, but LVP have been informed that these now needed to be reconsolidated.

Following a meeting with Elaine Moles Practice Manager LVP and Cllr John Britt Lenham Parish Council emergency planning rep, LVP have confirmed that they will be contacting the many people the volunteering scheme covers and outlining the new position, notifying all such patients in the next 24 / 48 hours that the current arrangement will be ending and the advising details of new arrangements in the next few days. There may be some cross-over but this will be avoided as much as possible. 15

- LVP will ensure that working with the volunteering service a "note" which
  through the volunteering service, will be passed onto the most vulnerable that
  cannot be contacted from the patient list currently receiving their meds from
  LVP pharmacy to get them onto LVP's regular delivery schedule, should they
  qualify. Those who do not qualify for delivery from LVP pharmacy can continue
  to nominate a volunteer to collect medication on their behalf.
- We have been informed that Harrietsham surgery will be considered for opening at the earliest opportunity, however there are practical and obvious issues that need to be overcome, which LVP are working on. Paper prescriptions will continue to be collected daily from the surgery, if posted into that box. Those unable to access either the Harrietsham or Lenham surgeries to hand in their repeat prescriptions can continue to hand these to volunteers who will ensure that they are delivered to LVP for processing and authorisation.
- In the meantime, Saxon Warrior Pharmacy has agreed to retain the volunteering service, and SWP will continue the process of collecting authorised scripts from LVP and via our volunteering service continue the current process of medication delivery where needed. All of the protocols, some of which now will be amended from the collection from LVP will be under the direction of Bipin Patel SWP manager, working with our volunteering service. The volunteering service will, in co-operation with Martin Sherwood our community warden, continue to collect paper scripts when needed via contacting our volunteering service. This will be done usually each morning before 11am.
- Finally, there was a recognition that there might be a need to be a change to the new arrangement, should the pandemic spike as all expected that it would. This will be closely monitored, and there will be practical flexibility if needed.

The volunteering service has evolved and changed throughout and it will surely with collaboration continue to meet whatever is needed from it given the volunteers abilities and availability.

We would like to thank both LVP and SW teams for their assistance during the crisis. We have appreciated their assistance in delivering much needed supplies through a difficult and dark period. We hope, having established professional, positive and friendly relationships, that this will continue through whatever comes our way.



While you're waiting why not cook up a storm with Peter's

#### Chicken with Chorizo and Peppers.

This is one of my favourite recipes based on one published in the Daily Telegraph about 10 years ago but adjusted several times to suit my taste. The initial preparation only takes about 20 mins and then the oven does the rest enabling me to get on with other things.

- 4 Chicken Thigh fillets
- 2 Tablespoons Olive oil
- 1 Red Pepper & 1 Yellow Pepper, de-seeded and cut into 1" squares
- 1 Onion finely diced
- 2 cloves garlic finely chopped
- 1 sprig fresh Rosemary
- 8 pieces Chorizo Sausage about 1/8" thick
- 2 Glasses Dry White wine
- Salt & Black pepper to taste

Trim any excess fat off the chicken fillets, heat the oil in a large pan and seal the fillets on both sides, remove to a plate. Lightly sauté the peppers, onion, garlic and Rosemary for about 5 minutes, put the chicken back in the pan and add the white wine, add the chorizo and mix well. At this stage I put the ingredients in my slow cooker and cook it on the high setting for 2 hours until the chicken is well done and the peppers are soft, but I have also cooked it in an oven proof casserole in the oven for about 1½hours at 150° Check occasionally during cooking to make sure it hasn't dried out and add a drop of water if necessary, serve with new potatoes. I really like the flavour the Rosemary and Chorizo give this dish but if you don't want loose bits of Rosemary place it inside a piece of muslin and remove it just before serving.



#### **Top Tips** by Harrietsham Gardening Society

September is a very rewarding month in the garden when all the hard work of spring and summer pays off. In the vegetable garden, maincrop potatoes can be lifted once the tops have died off, onions and shallots can be lifted for storing right round to next spring, sweetcorn cobs picked, marrows and squash for storing up until year end and an eye kept open for caterpillars on winter greens such as sprouts, cabbages and cauliflower to overwinter. It's hard work but drawing soil up around leek plants helps enormously in ensuring long blanched white stems. Keep cleared ground as weed free as possible too as that will help when you start digging in November – not before or the weeds will grow back again. Hopefully, you have winter carrots in the ground which can stay there until the end of next month before any frosts are likely. They are very attractive to slugs and snails so keep an eye out for those as they can be very busy in a warm damp September. Well, most of them, not all – the lazy snails who lose their shells become very sluggish! To get the best of the balance of your tomato crop most of the leaves can be removed now but don't pick any green tomatoes until well into October.

In the flower garden September is the time to divide herbaceous perennials to enhance your display next year. Dead heading of roses, dahlias and almost any flowering plant will keep them going too. Later this month plant daffodils, narcissi, crocuses, hyacinths and other spring flowering bulbs to ensure a good display next spring. Hopefully, you will have trimmed your beech, hornbeam and yew hedges.

September is traditionally the time to sow a new lawn as the ground is still warm and some rain can be expected. The same thing applies to turf. Laying turf now and keeping it well watered will help it root and become useable much more quickly.

Mentioning lawns reminds me of the story regarding an alien who returned to Harrietsham after a previous visit some 100 years ago following pressure from his grandson who had visited recently. He was very interested in gardens and nature and upon arrival was very worried at the change in gardening habits. He said to his grandson 'What in the world is going on down here? What happened to the dandelions, daises, buttercups and stuff I saw last time? Those plants are very low maintenance, they grow in any type of soil, withstand drought and multiply with abandon. The nectar from the long-lasting blossoms attracts butterflies, honeybees and flocks of songbirds. All I see now are these green rectangles.'

His grandson replied, 'Fashions have changed, people started calling the wildflowers weeds and went to great lengths to kill them and replace them with grass.'

'Grass? But it's so boring - it's not colourful, it doesn't attract butterflies, birds or bees, only ants and daddy long-legs and it's temperamental with temperature. Do these people really want all that grass growing there?'




